I am enclosing also different Statistics to enable the reader to form an idea of the expectations of this country which will-I hope- reach very shortly the standard of other civilized countries.

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A SHORT SUFVEY OF EDUCATION IN U.A.E.

Before the U.A.E came into existence Education was in the hands of individuals . Some private schools were built like the Ahmadeya School , Saa'da, Falah in Dubai , Quasemeya in Sharjah and similar schools in other Emirates.

Later on , some Arab countries sent delegations of teachers and built schools such as Kuwait, Egypt, Qatar, Saudi Arabia and Bahrain.

Modern formal education started in 1952.

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DIFFERENT STAGES OF EDUCATION .

1- General Education :-

- A- Primary Education: 4 years (Schools following Qatar system: 6 years)
- B- Intermediate Education : 4 years (Schools following Qatar system: 3 years and are called Preparatory Schools)
- C- Secondary Education : 4 years .

The whole period is 12 years like most of the Arab countries.

2- Technical education:-

A- Trade Schools:

This kind of education started in 1958 and was mere vocational at first. Its aim was to give training to the natives. There were no entrance requirements. Seven years later academic subjects such as arithmatic and English were introduced and period of study become four years instead of two.

After the Ministry had come into power it took over the Trade Schools and period of study was divided into two stages:-

Preparatory ; 3 years
Secondary : 3 years
Students should finish six years of general education
before joining these schools.

There are courses in carpentry, electricity, mechanical engineeringetc.

B- Commercial Schools:-

The aim of these schools is to supply students with enough details about commercial and Secretarial work and to prepare them to hold clerical posts in their country.

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The standard here is similar to the secondary school: Academic subjects are studied such as languages, accountancy, book-keeping and typing.

C- Agricultural Schools.

The first attempt of introducing this type of education began in 1962. The Agricultural Secondary School was set up in 1967 to prepare agricultural technicians who can run farms or hold posts in agricultural guidance and Veterinary guidance. The period of study is four years after which the student gets the Diploma of subjects Agricultural Secondary Schools. Academic are taught at this school such as languages, mathematics, science, animal breeding, general agriculture, agricultural engineeringetc.

3- Religious Education :-

This embraces Primary, intermediate and secondary stages. This type of education pays special attention to religious subjects beside other academic subjects such as languages, mathematics, science.. etc.

4- Teacher training institutes :-

This institutes were established in 1966/67. Holders of the Intermediate certificate can join them, Period of study is four years after which graduated get Teacher, training Diploma which qualifies them to teach at Primary Schools. These institutes have stopped registring students this year.

The Ministry is planning to set up Teachers' Institutes that take holders of G.C.E. There is also a plan to set up secretarial Institutes.

- Conferences and Organizations:

1- ADMINISTRATIVE AND FINANCIAL DEPARTMENT

This department is entrusted with putting into force all the decisions of the Ministry in co-operation with the Ministry of Finance. It supervise the personnel section which appoints officials and completes their files and arranges procedures for absence, leave and deduction.

On the financial plane it puts into action the decisions of the Ministry , it prepares and revises Salaries , pays contractors and importers supplies schools' needs , undertakes purchases in cooperation with the Ministry of Finance, revises contracts, Pays scholarship Students' fees , prepares the budget and in a word everything related to financial affairs.

2- CULTURAL DEPARTMENT

This department is charged with everything related to cultural affairs. It supervises school libraries and the Ministry's public library. The department also is responsible for missions sent to universities abroad whether in Arab countries or elsewhere. This department also supervises all affairs related to international cultural organizations and exchanges cultural newsletters, bulletins & pamphlets .

3- PLANNING AND INSPECTORATE SECTION

Planning section studies schools' needs:
teachers, classes, laboratories or activities' rooms. It also
co-ordinates between the differed subjects concerning appointments,
promotions based on reports which are kept in employees' files.
It also includes representatives of the different subjects. It
makes a follow-up of inspectors' work. It also makes analytical
Statistics on which are based the expectations of new intakes in
the coming years.

Different inspectorates arrange training courses and refresher courses for teachers and also give them estimates.

There are also other activities undertaken by inspectors such as Educational and cultural activities on Television and at the Broadcasting station . They are also asked to set down promotion examination questions.

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Inspectors hold periodical meetings to discuss technical problems , submit recommendations to the authorities in the Ministry ${\color{black} \bullet}$

4- PHYSICAL TRAINING & SCOUTS

This section is in charge of sports and athJetic activities in side the schools and also out—of—doors.It arranges league competitions among schools and sports festivals.

The Ministry encourages the Scouts movement and helps in constructing Scouts Comps and urges the exchange of Scouts' visits: locally and internationally .

5 - EDUCATIONAL AIDS SECTION

This section prepares illustrative boards, maps, clippings and stencils. It has also started an embaming section to embalming bodies as means of illustration. It also has a film Library and collections of slides.

This section supplies the schools with tapes covered with Koran, music and anthems.

6- STUDENTS AND EXAMINATIONS DEPARTMENT

This section is concerned with the acceptance of students in the different stages of education. It also revises students registers. It receives monthly Statistics from Schools.It issues registration cards for students.

The Examinations' Department explains in its circulars Examinations' Regulations. It also fixes Examinations' time tables for promotion and general certificate examinations.

This department also revises the examinations results at the end of the year.

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7- LITERACY AND ADULT EDUCATION SECTION

This Department prepares Adult Education Centres and supervises them in co-operation with the Arab league Organization for culture, science and Education and other international oraganizations. Classes were opened for literacy and Adult Education .Students from both sexes frequent these evening classes: first year comprises the syllabuses of first and second primary, second year comprises third and fourth primary years syllabuses,

Students who finish the literacy stage may join the Intermediate evening classes.

8- PRIVATE EDUCATION SECTION

This section supervises private schools and make a follow-up of the Private Education law. It also controls the syllabuses at the private schools and ascertains that they correspond with the general education tends of the State.

There are also other sections which offer services to the Ministry and schools such as the general stores concerned with books, stationery, furniture, laboratory equipment .. etc, the garage, workshops, ..etc.

The Ministry is about to set up other department and sections such as: Statistics section, books and curricula section, training section ..etc.

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
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
GROWTH OF CLASSES

Number of classes




IN THE DIFFERENT STAGES OF U.A.E.SCHOOLS


OROWTH OF STUDENTS
