Analysis of the Private Sector Import in Oman  
during the period January - June 1973.

Introduction

Private Sector (or duty paid) Import statistics received from the Custom Department for the period January - June 1973 has been reclassified in the National Statistical Department under SITC (Revised) Sections. A comparison of imports during the first six months of 1973 with that of similar period of 1972 has been made in this note. The note does not give complete picture about imports in Oman since goods at present exempted from duty are excluded for want of recorded statistics.

Imports classified under SITC Sections

2. Private Sector imports during January - June 1973 in Oman have been of the order of 13.3 million rial omani against the import of 9.5 million rial omani during the corresponding period of 1972. Thus, there has been increase of 3.8 million rial omani or 40.5 percent in the imports during first six months of 1973 as compared to the similar period during 1972.

3. The following table shows import (first six months only) of 1972 and 1973 under S.I.T.C. Sections:

The maximum percentage increase (105%) is in mineral fuels and lubricants and the minimum (5%) in beverages and tobacco. For other items the increase is shown above.

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Private Sector Imports in Oman  
During the period January - June 1973

Imports under SITC Section

Private Sector Imports during January - June 1973 in Oman have been of the order of 13.3 million rial against the import of 9.5 million rial during the corresponding period of 1972. Thus there has been an increase of 38.4 million rial or 40.4 percent in the imports during first six months of 1973 as compared to the similar period during 1972.

Imports under SITC Section

Private Sector Imports during January - June 1973 in Oman have been of the order of 13.3 million rial against the import of 9.5 million rial during the corresponding period of 1972. Thus there has been an increase of 38.4 million rial or 40.4 percent in the imports during first six months of 1973 as compared to the similar period during 1972.

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Report classified under S.I.T.C. Divisions

4. Divisionwise import figures for the first six months of 1972 and of 1973 are given in Appendix I to this note. The following are the main observations:

- i) Under Section No. 0 - Food and Live Animals, the increase is maximum (427%) for live animals, followed by fruits and vegetables (164%), dairy products and eggs (91%), Cereal and cereal preparations (82%) and sugar and sugar preparation (82%). On the other hand the imports decreased under coffee, tea etc., and miscellaneous food preparations.
- ii) Under Section No. 1 - Beverages and Tobacco, while there has been decline in import of beverages (-5%), there is increase in the import of tobacco and tobacco preparation (10.9%).
- iii) Under Section No. 3 - Mineral fuels and Lubricants, the increase is due to larger imports of petroleum and petroleum products (93.5%).
- iv) Under Section No. 5 - Chemicals, the increase in imports is on chemical elements and compounds (93%), Dyeing, tanning and colouring materials (91%) and plastic materials (63%).
- v) Under Section No. 6 - Manufactured goods, the increase is more or less uniform on various items but there has been decline in the imports of leather and leather manufactures (-57%).
- vi) Under Section No. 7 - Machinery and Transport Equipment, the maximum percentage increase is for machinery other than electric (476%), and transport equipment (69%).
- vii) Under Section No. 8 - Miscellaneous manufactured goods, the increase is on sanitary, plumbing, heating and lighting fixtures (140%), miscellaneous manufactured articles (336%) and a number of other articles included under the Section.

The maximum percentage increase (100%) is in live animals and leather and the minimum (0%) in beverages and tobacco. The other items show increase in some degree.

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Imports classified under various Divisions

4. Divisions under which for the first six months of 1973 and of 1972 are given in Appendix I in this report. The following are the main observations:

- (i) Under Section No. 0 - Food and Live Animals, the increase is mainly due to live animals followed by coffee and tea. Under Section No. 1 - Beverages, the increase is mainly due to wine and beer. Under Section No. 2 - Chemicals, the increase is mainly due to fertilizers and pesticides. Under Section No. 3 - Textiles, the increase is mainly due to cotton and wool. Under Section No. 4 - Metals, the increase is mainly due to iron and steel. Under Section No. 5 - Machinery and Transport Equipment, the increase is mainly due to transport equipment. Under Section No. 6 - Miscellaneous Manufactured Goods, the increase is mainly due to electrical and electronic goods. Under Section No. 7 - Petroleum and Lubricants, the increase is mainly due to petroleum products. Under Section No. 8 - Minerals, the increase is mainly due to minerals. Under Section No. 9 - Miscellaneous, the increase is mainly due to various goods.

Imports classified under countries of Import

5. The relative share of imports from various countries to Oman, in terms of percentage, for the years 1970, 1971, 1972 and 1973 (January-June) is shown in Appendix II. Trade originating from Gulf Countries (U.A.E., Bahrain and Qatar) almost consists of goods originating from countries other than Gulf. The significant feature is that while in 1970 only 12.8 percent of total import to Oman was from Gulf countries, this percentage has increased to 25.1 percent during the first half of 1973.
