CROWN PRINCE OPENS GF's NEW TRISTAR SIMULATOR

Gulf Air's new Tristar simulator was officially opened by Bahrain's Crown Prince and Commander-in-Chief of BDF, Shaikh Hamad Bin Isa Al Khalifa on January 25, 1984.

GF rolled out its red carpet for the Crown Prince during the simple but impressive ceremony which was held at the Simulator Centre in Muharraq.

At the centre to greet him were Bahrain's Vice-government and Industry Minister Mr. Abdulla Saif, GF executive committee, H.E. Yousef Shriawi, the Under-Secretary Ministry of Development and Industry and GF Board member H.E. Shaikh Isa Bin Abdulla Al-Khalifa, the Governor of Bahrain Monetary Agency and GF Board member H.E. Abdulla Hassan Saif, Director-General of Civil Aviation and GF Board member Shaikh Hamad Bin Abdulla Al Khalifa, GF Chief Executive Mr. Ali Ibrahim Al Malki and other top officials.

On arrival, Shaikh Hamad was presented with a bouquet of flowers by eight-year-old Lamies.

Dressed in the uniform of a GF stewardess, pretty Lamies won the hearts of the Crown Prince and all others present.

He was then introduced to a number of GF national pilots by DGMO, Capt. A.R. Al Gaoud before being escorted to the simulator proper where he was briefed on the working of the simulator.

Later, accompanied by Capt. Al Gaoud, Shaikh Hamad who holds a helicopter pilot's licence, entered the mock-up Tristar cockpit and "flew" the BD 4 million simulator out of "Bahrain airport" and into several foreign destinations.

The simulator, which came into operation last September, is one of the most sophisticated of its type, equipped with the latest techniques to create realistic flying sensations.

A "visual" simulation system depicts night or dusk at London, Paris or Hongkong airports. About a dozen GF pilots and flight engineers undertake "flights" or regular proficiency tests on it.

On "landing" back in Bahrain, Shaikh Hamad was taken on a tour of the hangars where he shook hands with all the engineering staff who had lined up to welcome him.

He later visited the hangar area where GF is currently carrying out a "D" check on one of its Boeing 737s, the first time that such a check is held in Bahrain.

Before saying good-bye, the Crown Prince thanked GF officials for having the opportunity to visit the new simulator and the other areas.

Later, the Crown Prince sent a letter to Mr. Shriawi expressing his thanks for the visit to the centre. H.E. Shaikh Hamad said he was extremely impressed by what he saw and praised GF management and staff for their efficiency in making Gulf Air a top airline. He commended the management in their successful efforts in developing GF and maintaining the best service in the Gulf.

8TH COMMERCIAL CONFERENCE TAKES OFF ON QUEST FOR GROWTH



Gulf Air's eighth annual commercial conference opened at the Gulf Hotel in Bahrain recently with the airline's top executives pledging to ensure more growth and expansion of the company.

The two-day meeting, held on January 28 and 29, was officially opened by the Minister of Development and Industry and chairman of GP Executive Board, Mr. Yousef Al Shirawi.

In his opening address, Mr. Shirawi praised the company for its impressive performance in the past year and attributed this to a sense of professionalism that has taken place in the last 10 years since the airline was officially formed.

"Over the last 10 years, we began to notice two changes — the fever of innocence, the fever of youth that captured our imagination in the 70s has been replaced by a calm sense of professionalism, competence and confidence in the future," he said.

Mr. Shirawi also paid special tribute to the pilots of the ill-fated GF 771 flight who died along with all passengers in the accident last September.

"The way the management reacted and the way those pilots behaved in those hectic circumstances before their final flight is a tribute of professionalism of this airline, and is a tribute really to its industrial relationship," he said.

The chairman expressed faith in the board's expansion plans for the future but cautioned them against being "too harsh" in protecting GF routes from competition.

He predicted that the coming five years would see many new restrictions on local airlines and competition would become even more intense. "But we pledge, we promise, that whatever they skin from our own milk, there will still be something for us," said Mr. Shirawi.

Chief Executive, Mr. Ali Ibrahim Al Malki, who also addressed the meeting, did not spare words in stressing the need for more growth and expansion of GF routes.

Mr. Al Malki pledged to fight for the survival of the airline and for the survival of the economics of the Gulf.

He said the airline had turned in profits con-sistently even though it had only



seven international routes but to ensure the airline's continuing survival, it was now necessary to expand.

He hoped that in the long run, Gulf Air would become a trans-Pacific and trans-Atlantic carrier. He also hoped GF's sole Boeing 747, at present flying to SEA, for the Bahrain-Manila route, would be extended to other future routes.

But while it was easy to buy extra aircraft, the more difficult task of getting traffic rights to new destinations also had to be faced, he said. He said GF was prepared to take on all the competition from other airlines for the lucrative Gulf market, provided it got a fair chance.

"I don't care who comes into the Gulf or with what frequency. We need just one thing — reciprocity," said the chief executive.

Referring to the GF 771 accident in September last year, Mr. Al Malki said the airline was still trying to find out exactly what had gone wrong. Meanwhile, the airline will take all measures to safeguard its passengers and equipment, he said.




"I hope we will not see such a tragedy again but as long as we are flying, there is always the possibility we would have one. We are still trying to find out exactly what happened," he said.

The third speaker in the conference was General Manager Financial Affairs, Mr. Hassan Juma, who said traffic growth had obviously been affected by the effects of the drop of oil prices on the region's economics.

Despite this, the airline had been strong enough to turn in profits this year, he said. However, although international traffic generally was predicted to grow by only 4 per cent this year, GF was aiming for a 14 per cent increase, he said.

Mr. Juma also forecasted a rise in company costs which had risen by four per cent in 1981-82, six per cent in 1982-83 and is expected to jump 14 per cent in 1983-84.

More than 150 staff from GF's network throughout the world attended the two day meeting which was chaired by General Manager Commercial, Mr. Nick Mousaffari.



CHARLEY STEALS THE LIMELIGHT

For the first time in the Gulf, participants at the Annual Commercial Conference met an unusual TV star called "Charley".

Charley is a cartoon character on a TV movie, which is created by a behind-the-scenes operator with a puppet able to interact with the audience.

He became a member of the Advertising Panel consisting of Mike Simon, Advertising Manager; Peter Handley, Vice President Europe & Middle East of GF's advertising agency Kenyon & Eckhardt; Michael Garland, Managing Partner of the lead agency and Doug McNab, the account director.

Mike Simon and his team presented the advertising plans for 1984 using several different audio-visual techniques with a multi-vision show as the grand finale.

During the presentation a new "Golden Lion" was announced for the company for 1984—a "facility" which will be reflected in stationery, ticket boarding cards, promotional material—even the painting of GF vehicles. At the same time a new Corporate Design Manual, now under production, would be delivered to the managers to help strengthen the corporate identity.

In a cross-the-table discussion—with Charley making a number of "interrupt-



tions"—the team also showed a selection of international advertisements which would shortly be appearing in the press and told the meeting they had brought with them a number of alternative concepts to discuss with GMC and Chief Executive.

A new one-year sponsorship of a Porsche 911 rally car (to be driven by Gulf Air engineer Chris Wales) was also announced at the conference, together with cost evaluation of the sports teams with which GF has been involved.

Main features from the presentation were: advertising had "kicked off" the

year with an "inflight survey" campaign which was proving very popular with passengers. 15 new posters will shortly be delivered to the field offices, a new cube-construction window display would follow shortly for travel agents and GF ticket offices. Kodak carousel projectors had been purchased and slide programmes were being prepared. A prestigious corporate brochure was now under production, new giveaways had been acquired, a photography contest would be staged for next year's GF calendar and new TV commercials were being planned.

The advertising presentation was brought to a climax by a multi-session show produced by Mike Simon and planned to demonstrate the advertising the Gulf owner states and Gulf Air. Using three projectors and a computerised dissolve unit, the programme traced the history of the Gulf from the days of pearl-diving and camel herding to today's oil-rich emirates with Gulf Air as the market leader. It is intended that the slide and sound programme will be transferred to a video tape and distributed throughout the network with language versions.

As well as individual market discussions on advertising everyone at the meeting expressed deep interest in Charley—and the verdict on the advertising presentation was "very professional".

GULF AIR CARRIES OUT ITS FIRST D-CHECK ON ITS BOEING 737

Gulf Air is currently carrying out a scheduled major maintenance check—the 'D' Check—on its Boeing 737 for the first time in Bahrain.

The Deputy General Manager (Technical), Mr. Ahmed Abdul Ghani, said the aircraft is the first of the airline's eight Boeings to come up for the 'D'-check, carried out after it has completed 14,000 flying hours.

More than 20,000 man-hours of work is involved in this massive overhaul operation whereby the plane is stripped apart completely and every part is examined against any defect. The maintenance and engineering staff will be working round-the-clock, to complete the task in four weeks' time.

Mr. ABDUL Ghani said the 'D'-checks will be carried out on all the other Boeings over the next three years. At each of the aircraft's stops it will be grounded for at least a month; the national carrier had scheduled its winter flights this year so as not disrupt its commercial services.

He added that the airline had planned towards this giant project nearly two years ago in line with its policy to eventually carry out all its own maintenance work in the Gulf.

"The carrying out of the 'D' Check here in Bahrain is a tremendous task in airline maintenance but we at Gulf Air are used to accepting demanding challenges and our record shows that we can produce excellent results", he said.

Gulf Air has always carried out all other maintenance checks on its Boeing 737s and minor checks on its nine Lockheed L1011 TriStars in Bahrain.

"We are proud to say that our highly experienced technical staff with their skills and experience are capable of carrying out the total maintenance work on our aircrafts and we look forward to being able to do similar extensive checks on our TriStars too in the near future", said Mr. Abdul Ghani.

GULF AIR CLUB MOVES TO BUDAIYA

Ismail Mohammed from UAE, who will be doing the 5-year Avionics course, said he was confident of doing well in his training and was


looking forward to serve GF.



CHIEF EXECUTIVE ATTENDS IATA'S 39TH AGM IN DELHI



Chief Executives of the world's airlines gathered in Delhi in October for the 39th annual meeting of the International Air Transport Association (IATA) which was inaugurated by the Prime Minister of India, Mrs. Indira Gandhi, on October 1.

Gulf Air, which is an associate member of IATA, was represented by C.E. Mr. Ali Ibrahim Al Maliki. He was accompanied by DCMR Mr. Hamad Al Wadi, Civil Technical Services, Mr. Mohamed Majeed, International Relations Manager, Sheikh Khalid Al Khalifa and Manager, India Mr. Mohammed Al Shafei.

The meeting, which expressed their concern at the substantial and growing amount of airline earnings being blocked by countries that impose currency transfer and other restrictions or delays. The problem, which has already affected wideranging in parts of Africa and Latin America, has created a backlog that could soon approach the equivalent of one billion US dollars, according to IATA.

The meeting also discussed the integrity of the worldwide network was at risk since the impediments to the transfer of airline funds may provoke retaliatory action that could lead to you the disruption of the network.

The airlines also pledged their full support of the efforts of the governmental International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO) and of individual governments to take steps in the legal and operational areas to prevent any future recurrence of such incidents as the downing of the Korean 747 and past instances of force being used.

The meeting also called on member airlines to cooperate with governments in eliminating barriers to air transport trade while affording members' commitment to fair trading conditions and workable competition.

The airlines, in taking further steps to curb malpractice in respect of official published tariffs, called on IATA's

Director General and its Executive Committee to give this programme priority and to study, where feasible, new implementation of sanction programme.

Another priority area identified was the exploration of the potential benefits of new approaches to intra-industry cooperation through the relevant airline bodies in the field of automation and data exchange.

Also at the AGM, IATA elected Mr. David Kennedy, Chief Executive Officer of British Airways, as President for the coming year, succeeding Shri Raghu Raj, chairman and managing director of Air India.

Mr. Kennedy becomes a member of the Executive Committee. The other new members of the 25-member committee are Mr. Ali Ghandour of the Royal Jordanian Airline, ALIA, and Mr. Helio Smith of Varig (Brazil).

The next IATA AGM will be held in Montreal, Canada, between October 29-30, 1984.

NEW MEMBERS
The following airlines have joined IATA bringing the total IATA members to 134. The three new members are Air Queensland Ltd; Lesotho Airways (Africa) and Mid Pacific Airlines (Hawaii).

IATA MEETING FOR AIRLINES

The International Air Transport Association (IATA) has arranged a meeting for airlines from around the world to get together next year for in-depth reviews of how commercial pilots are trained.

The aim of the meeting is to study the most up-to-date methods and techniques which will enhance aviation safety.

The special session has been arranged to be held in Montreal, Canada, on May 14 to 18. It is open not only to IATA member but non-members too who will be asked to pay a nominal fee. Gulf Air is a member of IATA.

This will be the sixth such meeting that has been taking place over three years. The last session, held in Miami, Florida, attracted more than 200 participants. With the meeting open to non-members too this time, attendance is expected to be even higher.

Topics to be discussed will range from training in the new technologies to flying with wind-shear, one of the hard-to-detect and serious threats to air safety and one which pilots must learn new techniques to combat.

Leading industry experts have also been invited to present papers on a wide variety of subjects.

INTER-GULF AIR LINK

Members of GCC airlines met in Bahrain recently to discuss new fare structures within the Gulf and to encourage travel within the GCC states.

The meeting, organised by GCC Committee for Fares and Tariffs, met at the Gulf Hotel for the two-day meeting which was attended by top officials from the member states. Civil Aviation Directors plus representatives of the member airlines of Gulf Air, Saudi Airways and Kuwait Airways.

The main outcome of the meeting which took place on October 31 and November 1, 1983, was the introduction of an integrated Gulf timetable that combines services of all GCC nations' airlines.

A committee spokesman said that with the introduction of the new timetable, which came into effect on November 1, 1983, extra flights have been added to all the major cities of the region.

The spokesman said that the new timetable made it easy for the citizens and residents of GCC countries to move between principal cities on a daily basis.

"The aim is to link all the GCC states by air services through a more efficient system," said the spokesman.



The committee also studied several plans to introduce new package fares so as to promote travel within the Gulf for GCC citizens.

GF CHEFS GET TOGETHER

These were some of the problems tackled by Gulf Air's outstation chefs when they gathered together in Bahrain recently for the fourth annual chefs seminar.

The two-day seminar, on November 2 and 3, was held at the Gulf Hotel and was attended by the airline's 14 chefs from its stations in London, Cairo, Cyprus, Bahrain, Doha, Abu Dhabi, Dubai, Muscat, Karachi, Delhi, Bombay, Colombo and Amman.


Catering and Cabin Services Manager, Mr. John Shaw, said Gulf Air's problems were no different from other air carriers "except GF ensures the problems are not repeated."

Being a member of the Chaine des Rotisseurs is a clear indication of the high standards set by us, he added.



He said GF's food budget amounted to BD5.7 million in 1983 and "a bigger budget has been drawn for next year."

One of the main topics of discussion at the seminar was a new set of menus to be introduced in April 1984.



"We've come up with some very attractive dishes bound to please our passengers," said Mr. Shaw. Actual testing of the dishes was carried out in the respective stations in December before a final decision is made.

To make cooking more easier for the chefs and eating a pleasure for the passengers, the new recipes have been worked out according to availability of food ingredients in the different stations.

Another new move has been introduction of meals according to routes i.e. more emphasis would be given on continental food on London/Europe routes while oriental dishes will be introduced on routes covering the Far East.

"The menus have been worked around the routes so as to fit the type of people we carry," added Mr. Shaw.

Moreover, the menus are changed every three months so that regular travellers do not get bored with the food served on the airline.

A quick glimpse of the new menus for 1984 showed a variety that is bound to please the palate of any traveller — either on the first class or economy seat. Listed below are some of the items that can be expected when the new menus are introduced:

Proposed menu for first class passengers on the London/Gulf route can expect the following choice:

Jellied Eels/Smoked Sprats; potted duck with juniper berries; fresh asparagus; herrings in rolled oats; chicken biryani; roast guinea fowl trout with almonds; fruit trifles; Florida torte and cheese tray.

On the Gulf/London route, there is:

Smoked salmon caprice; roast crown of lamb; chicken supreme estragon; mock turtle; roast rib eye of beef; steamed lemon sponge and crepe hormand, to name a few.

For the Gulf — Bombay/Delhi/Colombo route, the choice includes:

Sirloin steak burgundy; chicken curry; saffron rice; duckling lyonnaise; lamb kofta curry; vegetable vindaloo for vegetarians;

For Middle East travellers, particularly on the Gulf/Cairo sector, they can choose:

Baked Mousaka; lamb and pepper nashik; double lamb cutlets; Om Ali and Pineapple Andalusian.

For passengers who love oriental food, the can expect the following dishes on the Gulf/Hongkong/Bangkok route:

Barbecued king prawns; eight previous steamed chicken; fried noodles; Chinese vegetables; ginger/mushroom duck, lamb curry hinese style; oriental rice; apricot biscuit; cherry pancake.

And, on the Hongkong/Bangkok route there is roast pigeon with grapes; Shan ghaiane fried noodles; cantonese sliced chicken or Laksa — Malacca noodles.

For economy-class passengers, the menu is equally appetising and attractive. For example, travellers on the Gulf/London route can expect:

Chicken estragon or beef fry; Gulf style or grilled salmon steak for a more European taste. Desserts range from Gateau Mille Feuille to a more Middle Eastern Bint Al-Shahar — honey & nuts pie.

For the Gulf/Bombay/Delhi/Colombo/Cairo routes, there is a wide selection of European, Asian and Middle Eastern dishes such as Lamb Biryani; sirloin with mint sauce; and Hyderabadi panaces for vegetarians; Arabic grill or Maas sohita which is lean mutton pieces cooked in yoghurt.

With an average of 5½ thousand meals served a day on all GF routes, the new menu is food for thought for its passengers around the world.

The regional office will oversee the airline's operations throughout Europe, in every country from Cyprus to Scandinavia.



Alia to U.S.

Alia, the Royal Jordanian Airline, is planning its frequencies to the U.S. by adding scheduled services to Los Angeles in the spring of 1985. The airline will offer two weekly Amman-Chicago-Los Angeles and Amman-Houston-Los Angeles flights with a Lockheed L-1011-500. The additional flights will raise Alia's US frequencies to 10 weekly flights.



New Airport

Saudi Arabia's new King Fahd International airport was officially opened in Riyadh on November 16. Situated about 35 km., the 3.2 billion dollar international airport is an almost self-contained city covering 225 square km.

At the inauguration ceremony, His Majesty King Fahd of Saudi Arabia said the airport would be rated one of the greatest construction projects undertaken by Saudi Arabian government.

Air France to Riyadh

Air France has announced the opening of a new route between Paris and Riyadh from December 7. The airline will be the sole owner of the airline. At the end of 1981, BA reduced its equity in the airline from 23 per cent to a token five.

SAS adds leg-room

SAS will upgrade its DC-8 business class services to the Middle East and Africa. The airline will add pitch to the all-important leg room — in business class cabins has been increased three inches, to 37 inches. The middle seats on each side of the cabin have been permanently folded down to provide extra elbow room and table space.

Also new this winter will be a nonstop flight between Copenhagen and Jeddah. The DC-8 business class improvement will also cover routes to Karachi, Clacuta, Dar-Es-Salam, Athens, Beirut, Baghdad and Damascus.



Swissair Class

Swissair is to introduce a three-class system with business class on all its long-haul intercontinental routes from January 1, 1984. A spokesman for Swissair said that full details of the new three-class structure will be announced after the cost of the project has been formally approved by the airline's board of directors.


AEROSOL CONTAINERS, A FIRE HAZARD

It is very common for people to misuse and misinterpret the risks involved in the usage of aerosol containers. Many accidents have occurred due to this. In the airline business, these containers are often used in the form of airfresheners, insect killers, cleaners, etc.

Aerosol containers are a fire hazard. The propeller used to expel the product may be liquid petroleum gas or low boiling point halogenated hydrocarbons.

The hydrocarbons are non-flammable but give off toxic fumes when sprayed on hot surfaces. Liquid petroleum gas is highly flammable and there is the danger of an explosion if the containers gets heated. Containers with petroleum gas will cause the fire to spread when involved in a fire.



Aerosol containers should be stored in an airconditioned, flammable store. Stock should be kept to a minimum. Manufacturers' recommendations with

maximum permitted storage temperature should be followed.

Some people tend to keep airfresheners in their cars.






