Introduction

As usual another good year ! The recorded value of goods entering or leaving Dubai and its Free Zones increased by 16% to US \$24.5 billion.

Notable variations were :

- (a) The People's Republic of China replacing Japan as the No.1 source of Dubai's direct imports, and
- (b) A drop of 23% in our re-exports to Iran.

Variation (a) was caused by diversions of many Japanese shipments to the Jebel Ali Free Zone and the sourcing of Japanese goods from Japanese subsidiaries in China.

Variation (b) is probably a temporary hiccup caused by Iranian foreign exchange problems and was more than compensated for by increased re-export to the CIS countries and Hong Kong.

However the most reliable basis for calculating the true overall increase in trade is still the import figure (since the recorded re-export figures probably only represent about a third of actuals) and the combined Dubai direct and Free Zone figures rose to US\$18 billion from US\$ 15.5 billion in 1994.

When one realises that the total Government expenditure budget would have been in the region of US\$2 billion only, one can understand the extent and capacity of private funding readily available in Dubai.

The Government is concentrating on preserving this business environment by major refurbishment of the infrastructure and the promotion of the Free Zones.

It is balancing its own books by the removal of unnecessary subsidies, the enforcement of the Federally agreed import duty rate of 4% (thereby quadrupling the relevant income without seriously inconveniencing the business community) and successful husbandry in general.

Preface

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Import figures are collated from bills of entry and invoices showing actual CIF value of goods surrendered for clearance by the consignee. CIF value is converted into local currency at the rate of exchange current at the time of settlement. Weight of commodities in kilograms is gross.

Goods manifested to Dubai but imported with the declared option of re-shipment to a foreign destination (but not using the Free Zones or Duty Free storage Area) are included in the general import figures and are subsequently consolidated with re-exports when re-shipment is completed.

Goods manifested to ports outside Dubai but trans-shipped in Dubai by the carrier on its own responsibility are not included in the general import figures (except for the statement of tonnage landed) but have been listed separately by ultimate destination in the "Summary of through-shipment cargo". Such goods are not usually accompanied by invoices and details are limited to those shown in the manifest.

Exports and re-exports are compiled from export declaration forms, but in the case of country-crafts, declared manifests are often accepted. Values shown are FOB Dubai and weight in kilograms in gross.

Classification of goods is based on the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System (HS). In this publication, classification of imports by country of origin and exports and re-exports by destination is provided to section level only, but breakdown to the six-digit commodity level is available and may be seen at the statistics office or supplied on request against payment of appropriate fees. Also available at commodity level are the following analyses which may be supplied for a fee:

- (a) Imports by country of origin
- (b) Imports by country of shipment
- (c) Imports by currency of invoice
- (d) Imports by method of arrival (air, sea, land)
- (e) Exports and re-exports by country of destination

FREE ZONES AND DUTY FREE STORAGE AREA

All imports into and exports from Free Zones and Duty Free Storage Area appear on separate statements and are not included in any other figures except "Tonnage Landed". Imports into Dubai from these facilities are not treated as Free Zone or Duty Free Storage Area exports but are shown in separate statements and are naturally also included in the general Dubai import figures. No distinction is made between exports and re-exports from the Jebel Ali Free Zone.

CUSTOMS DUTY

All dutiable goods 4% on CIF value Dubai.

CIF value will normally be calculated by reference to the commercial invoices covering the relative shipment, but the Director of Customs is not bound to accept the figures shown therein and may set an estimated value on the goods which shall be final as far as duty is concerned.

Deductions on invoices for agency commissions and internal settlements between supplier and importer/agent are dutiable and will be added back for calculation of duty.

Other discounts are allowed as genuine reductions.

PART I

ITEMS EXEMPTED BY REASON OF THE STATUS OF THE IMPORTER

- A) All Items imported by or on behalf of H.H. the President of the UAE, Their Highnesses the Rulers, and the Crown Princes of the Emirates.
- B) All Items imported directly by:
 - 1) Federal Ministries and the Government Departments.
 - 2) Diplomatic and Consular Missions.
 - 3) Recognized non-profit making hospitals, medical missions and charitable organisations.
 - 4) Firms and institutions granted exemption rights by Their Highnesses the Rulers of the Emirates.
 - 5) Manufacturers holding industrial production licences issued by the UAE Ministry of Finance and Industry and the General Industry Corporation, provided the raw materials, partially processed items, machinery and equipment are for use in the licensed manufacturing process.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

- A) Imported by them directly or on their behalf, in which case a letter from the respective Diwan should be presented.
- B)
 - B1) Should produce:
 - a) A request letter
 - b) A copy of contract which specifies the exemption condition, in the case of indirect import.

Imports for the Army and Police, the exemption request is adequate to grant exemption.
 - 2) Customs would require a letter from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
 - 3) Customs would require a letter from the concerned Ministry/Department confirming the status.
 - 5) A letter from the Ministry of Finance & Industry should be produced confirming that the imported items are for use in the industry.

PART II

ITEMS EXEMPTED FOR SPECIAL REASONS

- 1) Products of member states of the Arab Gulf Co-operation Council, i.e. the agricultural, animal, industrial and natural resource products that are of national origin in accordance with article No. 3 of the Unified Economic Agreement and decisions issued within the GCC framework.
- 2) Goods accepted for Transit/Trans-shipment.
- 3) All commercial samples supplied free of charge and marked "not for sale" or "free sample".
- 4) All advertising materials and commercial bulletins (catalogues) not for sale.
- 5) 35mm Cinematographic film for public exhibition.
- 6) The Holy Quran. Books and printed matter directly imported by recognised non-profit making schools.
- 7) Goods imported for temporary exhibition which will then be re-exported.
- 8) Supplies, equipment, materials and spares for ocean going vessels of international shipping lines.
- 9) Marine Lubricants supplied to local shipping agents on an 'on consignment' basis and free of charge.
- 10) Aircraft operating equipment (handling, telecommunication equipment but not office equipment nor transport) and parts imported by or on behalf of international airlines for exclusive use in their aircraft.
- 11) Aviation fuel and aviation functional fluids.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

- 1) GCC Certificate of Origin should be produced.
- 4) The name and the trade mark of the company must be printed on the advertising materials. But if they are imported by the advertising agents then they will be considered dutiable items.
- 6) Customs will demand a certificate from the Ministry of Education confirming that the school is non-profit making.
- 7) Such items will be cleared against deposits refundable on re-exportation of the items and against a letter from the concerned authority regarding the exhibition.
- 8+9) These items are cleared from Customs against deposit until they are supplied to the ocean-going vessels and certificate of supply to the vessel is received.
- 10+11) Such exemption would require confirmation from the Department of Civil Aviation.

- 12) All personal effects (accompanied or unaccompanied).
- 13) Medicines in pharmaceutical forms such as tablets, capsules, syrups, creams and eye drops.
- 14) Veterinary medicines.

- 12) Definition: Passengers' clothes & garments and all items which can be carried by hand as passengers' baggage and accompanied pets and reasonable quantity of used unaccompanied baggage.
- 13) A letter from the Ministry of Health confirming that the imported items are medicines.
- 14) A letter from the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries confirming that the imported items are veterinary medicines.

PART III

ITEMS EXEMPTED SPECIALLY AS LISTED BELOW

- 1) Live animals chiefly for food and honey bees.
- 2) Meat, fresh, chilled and frozen of bovine animals, sheep, goats, poultry etc.
- 3) Fish and crustaceans, live, fresh and chilled.
- 4) Dairy products, cream, milk, cheese, eggs, natural honey etc.
- 5) Dates, edible fruits and vegetables, fresh, chilled or dried. Edible seeds and seeds for sowing.
- 6) Coffee, tea, spices, rice, wheat, maize (corn), barley and honey.
- 7) Animal and vegetable oils for human consumption.
- 8) Sugar, salt and infant milk powder.
- 9) Animal food.
- 10) Fertilizers and agricultural insecticides certified by the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

- 11) Timber, wood sawn and plywood.
- 12) Newspapers, journals, periodicals, plans and drawings, unused postage stamps etc. cheque forms, bank notes, stock and share certificates.
- 13) Made up fishing nets.
- 14) Natural pearls unstrung or temporarily strung.
- 15) Silver, unworked or in powder form.
- 16) Gold, unworked or in powder forms; coins (only those struck by the issuing authority of the currency they represent).
- 17) Iron and steel bars, rods, angles, channels and beams for use in building. Corrugated iron or aluminium sheets for roofing.
- 18) Re-usable containers for compressed or liquified gas and transport of goods.
- 19) Agricultural and farming machinery and equipment (including greenhouses).

Statistical notes on Dubai's overseas non-oil trade based on returns for the year 1995

1995 was another outstanding year for Dubai trade. The value of total trade (comprising total imports, exports and re-exports to and from Dubai, and external trade transactions through the Jebel Ali Free Zone, the Airport Free Zone and the ports Duty Free Storage Areas) soared 16 percent to Dirhams 90.06 billion (US\$24.5 billion) from Dirhams 77.64 billion (US\$21.12 billion) the previous year and volume was up 9.4 percent to 13,167,308 metric tons. The remarkable performance was partly due to the booming domestic consumer market and partly to the exceptional growth in the exports and re-exports sectors during the year. Consumer goods formed the bulk of the trade but imports also included raw materials for local industries and a proportion of capital goods. Total imports worth Dirhams 63.23 billion (US\$17.2 billion) nearly 10 percent up from Dirhams 57.58 billion (US\$15.67 billion) in 1994, made up 70 percent of the total trade and highlights Dubai's role as a regional and local distribution centre for merchandise trade. Exports and recorded re-exports rose 34 percent to Dirhams 26.83 billion (US\$7.3 billion) from Dirhams 20.06 billion (US\$5.46 billion) in 1994. The re-exports figures however cover only the officially recorded re-exports from the Emirate of Dubai and do not represent the true volume of imported goods that have left Dubai by a multitude of perfectly legal but unrecorded channels to the rest of the U.A.E. and the world. (Omani official import figures indicate an estimated true Dubai re-exports trade to Oman worth over Dirhams 3 billion instead of the recorded Dirhams 252 million). Regionally, Asia led with 54 percent of the total trade, followed by Europe with 26 percent, America 8 percent and AGCC 7 percent. Trans-shipment of goods through Dubai ports to destinations within the gulf and to the sub-continent, the U.S., Far East and Europe rose nearly 11 percent to 5,974,302 metric tons from

5,391,084 in 1994. Bunker sales to shipping at Dubai's major sea ports dropped 17.6 percent to 154,946 metric tons from 188,058 during 1994 but supplies of aviation fuels to the International Airport during the year rose 6 percent to 851,059 metric tons.

Dubai's direct trade (i.e. excluding external trade transactions through the Free Zones and Duty Free Storage Areas) accounted for over 80 percent of the Dubai total trade. The value of direct trade during the year rose 9.4 percent to Dirhams 72.393 billion (US\$19.7 billion) from Dirhams 66.173 (US\$18.0 billion) in 1994 and volume went up 1.7 percent. The disproportionate increase in volume was mainly due to the substantial drop in the import of bulky, low-value refined petroleum fuels and cement clinker as a result of the on-going process of import substitution.

Direct imports worth Dirhams 54.638 billion (US\$14.87 billion) recorded only modest increase partly due to genuine decline in the import of some leading categories of goods (eg. jewellery, silver bullion, construction machinery and vehicles) and partly to diversion of sizeable volumes of some imports to the Jebel Ali Free Zone, particularly electronics and garments. However textiles, the top most direct import commodity maintained its lead and registered sizeable increase during the year. There has been no change in the sources of imports and the top ten exporting countries accounted for nearly 69 percent of the total direct imports. For the first time China with a 10.56 percent share of the market replaced Japan (10.42 percent) as top supplier in direct imports as Japanese supplies are increasingly being routed through the Jebel Ali Free Zone or are sourced from Japanese 'offshore' factories set up in low-cost Far Eastern countries (such as China) and are recorded as imports from these countries. US is third with 8.07 percent share

followed by South Korea with 7.88 percent and India with 7.55 percent. Recorded imports from the AGCC countries a little over half consisting of refined petroleum products were worth Dirhams 1151 million or 2.11 percent of the total direct imports, but AGCC goods arriving overland into Dubai are excluded from these figures as they are either unrecorded (ex Oman) or recorded at Ghuweifat border post and included in the Abu Dhabi import figures.

Direct exports, boosted by a substantial increase in the price of primary aluminium in the world metal markets and unusually large shipments of marine oil production platforms during the year, rose 43 percent to Dirhams 4686 million (US\$1275 million) from Dirhams 3272 million (US\$891 million) in 1994. Volume went up 24.5 percent to 994,532 metric tons from 799,164 tons the previous year. However both the range of export products and their destinations remained fairly limited. The top 5 export products accounted for over 72 percent of the total direct exports. Primary aluminium, the principal export product worth Dirhams 1775 million made up 38 percent of the total, ready-made garments worth Dirhams 667 million accounted for 14 percent, marine oil production platforms worth Dirhams 493 million 11 percent, metal scrap worth Dirhams 248 million 5 percent and lubricating oils worth Dirhams 182 million 4 percent. Japan remained the top aluminium market followed by South Korea, Taiwan and Thailand while the platforms went to Gabon and the Congo Republic. Western Europe and the US took the bulk of ready made garments and scrap metal went to India and Pakistan. Shipments to AGCC countries consisting mainly of primary aluminium (Oman, Saudi Arabia), lubricating oils (Bahrain, Kuwait) and iron and steel structures (Qatar) worth Dirhams 769 million were 16.4 percent of the total direct exports. Nearly 47 percent of the total went to Asian destinations, 18 percent to Europe and 11 percent to Africa.

Direct re-exports comprising mainly consumer

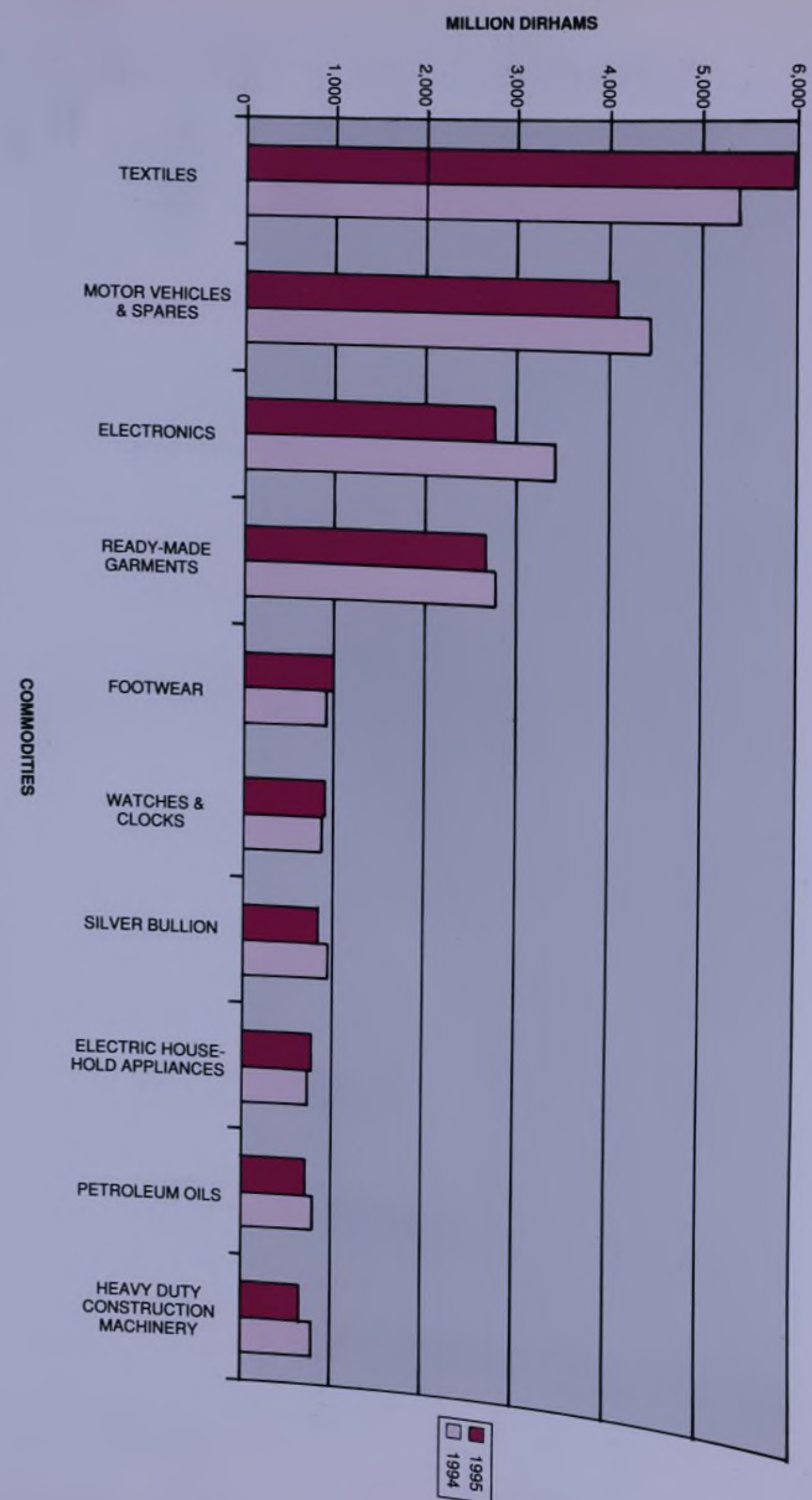
and light industrial goods registered remarkable growth during the year. The value rose 22.5 percent to Dirhams 13.069 billion (US\$3.56 billion) from Dirhams 10.670 billion (US\$2.90 billion) the previous year and volume went up 25.4 percent to 1,485,486 metric tons. Significant increases were recorded in shipments of motor vehicles, textiles, garments, and rice but there was a sizeable drop in the re-export of consumer electronics. Iran continues to be the leading re-export market in spite of a substantial drop in shipments during the year. Recorded re-exports to Iran dropped to Dirhams 3232 million from Dirhams 4186 million in 1994. The drop however was more than made up by larger shipments to Afghanistan, Azerbaijan, Russia and Hong Kong. 48 per cent of total direct re-export went to Asian countries, 17 per cent to Europe, 15 percent to AGCC countries and 10 percent to other Arab countries.

Trade through the Jebel Ali Free Zone registered substantial growth during the year. Imports rose 43 percent to Dirhams 11.672 billion (US\$3.18 billion) from Dirhams 8.163 billion (US\$2.22 billion) in 1994 and volume went up by over 32 percent to 2,012,378 metric tons. Imports consisted mainly of consumer goods for re-export but also included raw materials for the industrial sector. Exports from the Zone increased by 47 percent to Dirhams 8.724 billion (US\$2.37 billion) from Dirhams 5.929 billion (US\$1.61 billion) in 1994. Transfers from the Zone to the local market (recorded as direct Dubai imports) were also up 14 percent to Dirhams 3.274 billion (US\$891 million) from Dirhams 2.874 billion (US\$782 million). Trade through the Airport Free Zone - mainly in watches and electronics - was also up from Dirhams 345 million in 1994 to Dirhams 467 million in 1995 - an increase of over 35 percent. However trade through the Duty Free Storage Areas used mainly for storage of motor vehicles and foodstuff for the local market, dropped 14 percent from Dirhams 1110 million in 1994 to Dirhams 952 million in 1995.

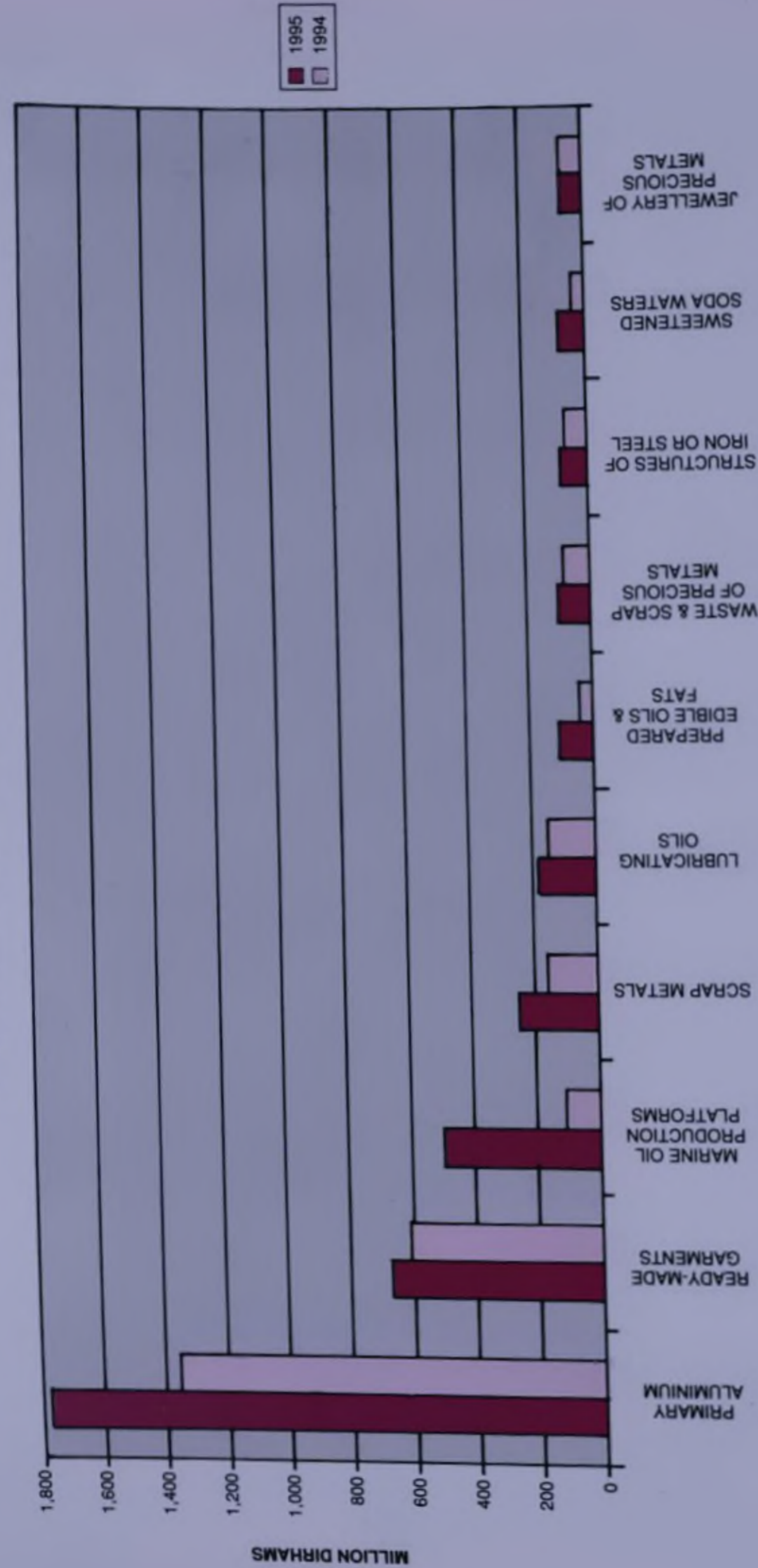

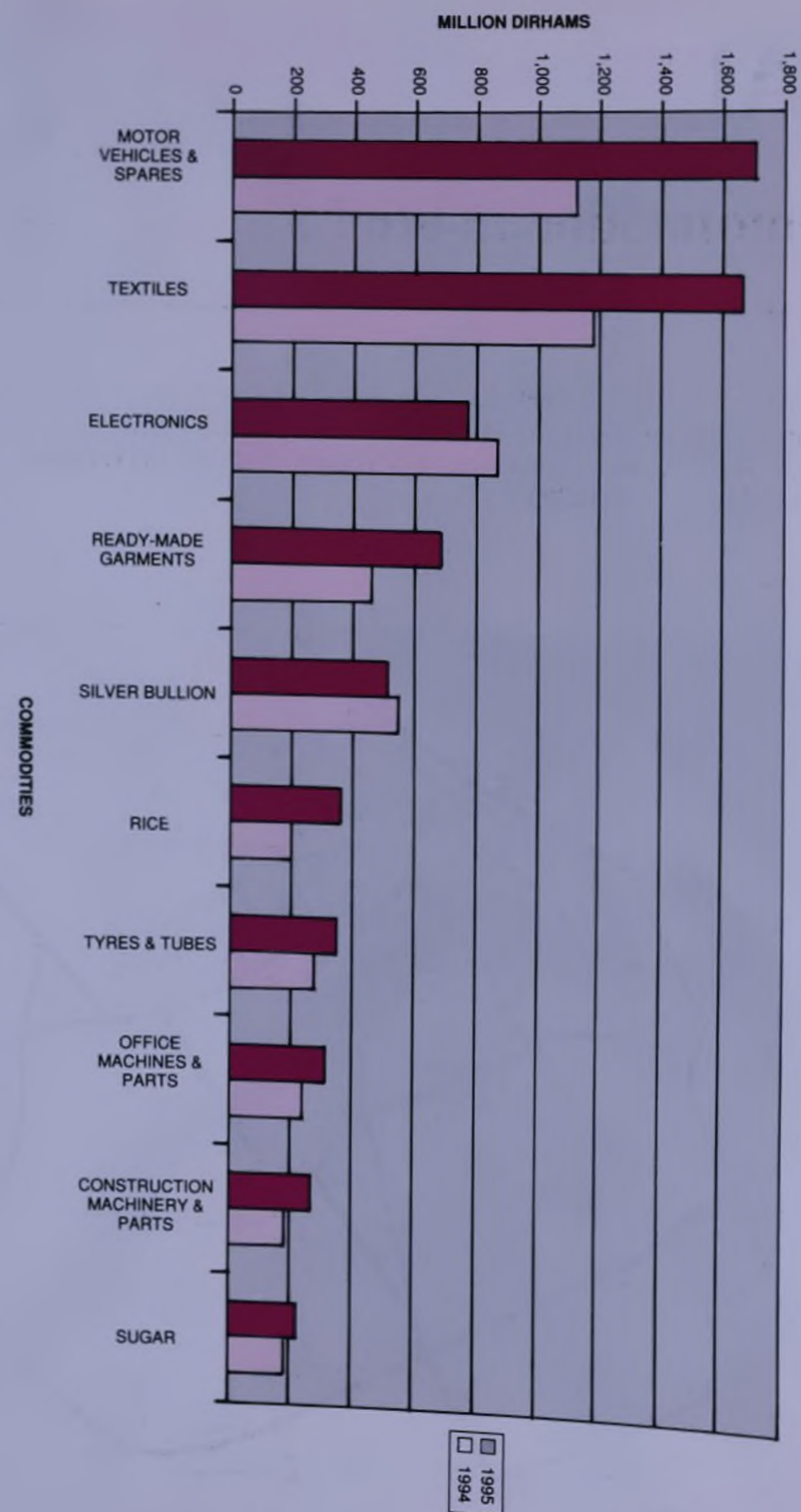

Economic, financial and banking trends in the United Arab Emirates

1. The General Economic Activity

During 1995, the performance of the U.A.E. economy continued to improve, owing to the positive developments witnessed in various economic sectors, particularly the oil sector. Gross domestic product (GDP), at factor cost recorded a growth rate of 6.6% during 1995, with the oil sector registering a rate of growth of 9.0% and the non-oil sectors achieving a rate of growth of 5.4%

Despite the State's continued adherence to the production quota set for the country by OPEC, the output of the oil sector grew to AED 49.2 billion in 1995, on account of the increase in oil prices, bringing its contribution to gross domestic product to 34.2 %.

The increase in output of the non-oil sector corresponds with the State's policy of reducing dependence on oil as a major source of income through diversification of the production base. Towards accomplishing this goal, the State has made great strides to enhance the economy's infrastructure and to set up a favourable environment for promoting the private sector's contribution to the process of economic development. Accordingly, the contribution of the non-oil sector rose to AED 94.8 billion in 1995.

Primarily, resulting from the increase in private consumption, final consumption rose in 1995 by 10.2%, as compared to an increase of 9.7% in 1994. At the same time, spending on imports of goods and services grew by 8.0% during 1995. The increase in final and private consumption, is mainly attributable to an

increase in the population and an associated rise in the demand for goods and services. Concurrently, the private sector's growing role in the economy also prompted an increase in the demand for goods and services to cover the additional demand resulting from the population increase.

Federal government spending, with its powerful impact on economic activity, rose by 12% in 1995 to reach AED 17.8 billion. The increase mainly occurred in current expenditure which constituted 97% of total public expenditure. Development expenditure, however, dropped by AED 191 million (26.1%) below 1994 levels.

Despite the improvement of oil income in 1995, growth in federal public revenues mainly occurred in own revenues, which increased by AED 443 million (12%) compared to 1994. This rise is mainly attributed to the application of a new custom tariff.

However, as federal public expenditure increased at a rate higher than the rate of increase in federal public revenues, a deficit of AED 943.1 million has been realized in the federal government's account, against a surplus of AED 547 million in 1994.

During 1995, the government embarked on a process of reviewing the feasibility of privatizing some State-owned enterprises with a view to expand the private sector and assign it a more active role in developing the national economy. The successful completion of this process may further diversify the economy and increase resources available for the State.

Measures taken by the Central Bank during 1995 aimed at supporting economic activity in the country. Private domestic liquidity grew by

10.2% reaching AED 81.40 billion, resulting from an increase by 10.7% in quasi-monetary deposits which reached AED 60.58 billion. Net foreign assets also had an expansionary impact on private domestic liquidity, reaching AED 63.9 billion at the end of 1995, an increase of 11.2%.

Preliminary estimates indicate that the improvement in international oil prices in 1995 reflected positively on foreign trade, as the value of exports and re-exports rose to AED 103.1 billion, while the value of imports recorded a total of AED 86.2 billion resulting in a trade surplus of AED 16.9 billion. At the same time, utilizing the strategic geographical location of the country, re-export trade, primarily to Asian and other Gulf countries, expanded to reach a total value of AED 35.0 billion.

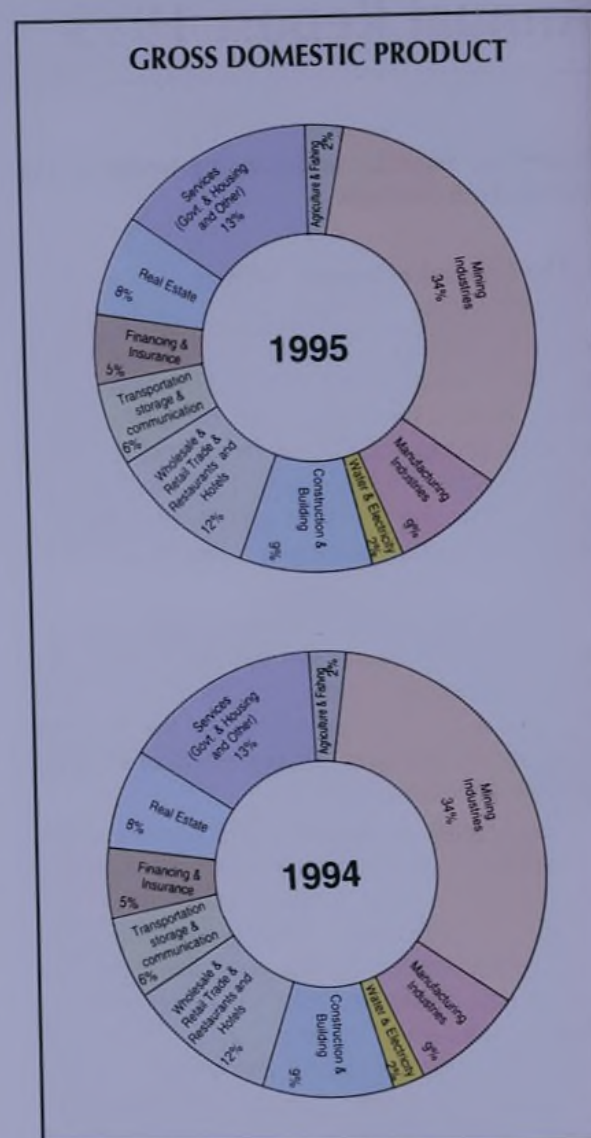
2. Developments of UAE gross domestic product

The U.A.E. Gross Domestic Product (GDP) at factor cost and at current prices, increased from AED 135.1 billion in 1994, to AED 144.0 billion in 1995, a rate of 6.6%.

The marked increase in 1995 GDP is primarily attributable to an increase in the contribution of the oil sector, which grew by 9%, to reach AED 49.2 billion in 1995, compared to AED 45.2 billion in 1994. The main factor behind this increase was an increase in average oil prices, as the average price rose to US\$ 16.7 a barrel in 1995, against US\$ 15.6 a barrel in 1994. Accordingly, the contribution of the oil sector to GDP rose from 33.4% in 1994 to 34.2% in 1995.

At the same time, the value of output of non-oil sectors rose from AED 89.9 billion in 1994 to AED 94.8 billion in 1995, recording an increase of AED 4.9 billion (5.4%) over the previous year.

This gain is the result of an increase in productive output from all of the non-oil economics sectors. The continued expansion of



activity in the non-oil sectors reflects the State's policy of diversifying the economic base and encouraging the private sector to play an effective role in economic development.

Utilizing the distinctive geographical location of the U.A.E. in promoting trade, particularly the export and re-export of non-oil commodities, the wholesale and retail trade, restaurants and hotels sector contributed 12.4% of GDP in 1995.

registering growth of 5.9%. In addition to trade related services, this sector includes tourism, whose significance continues to grow year after year. The contribution of government services to GDP reached 11.3%, as this sector grew by 2.6% in 1995. This reflects government services provided to U.A.E. citizens and residents in the health, education and cultural areas. The construction and building sector grew by 3.7% in 1995, bringing its contribution to 9.2% of GDP. This sector has continued to witness vigorous activity resulting from the execution of major public sector building projects, including road works, hospitals, schools and other public utilities, in addition to private sector building projects.

The manufacturing industries sector recorded a growth rate of 6.4% in 1995, with its relative contribution to GDP reaching 8.7%. The manufacturing and construction sectors, along with the wholesale and retail trade, restaurants and hotel sectors, have been the major contributors to the diversification of the economic base.

The real estate sector grew by 8.6% in 1995, bringing its relative contribution to 8.1%. Growth in this sector reflects an increase in the demand for residential and commercial buildings. However, despite a growth rate of 2.4%, the relative contribution of the transportation, storage and communication sector dropped to 5.9% in 1995, while the financing and insurance sector's contribution also decreased to 5%, despite a growth rate of 4%. The agriculture, live animals and fishing sector grew by 6.7% during 1995 and contributed 2.5% of GDP, while the water and electricity sector grew by 11.1% and contributed 9.2% of GDP.

As a result of the said increase in GDP alongwith population increase of 6.6% in 1995, GDP per capita remained at the same level recorded in 1994 at AED 60.6 thousands.

A review of developments in spending on GDP shows that final consumption has increased by 10.2% in 1995, compared to 1994. The bulk of this increase was attributed to the

rise in private consumption, which increased from AED 63.31 billion in 1994 to AED 71.24 billion (12.5%) in 1995. This development is mainly due to an increase in the population and in visitors to the U.A.E. An increase in prices also contributed.

At the same time, public consumption rose by 4.1%, to reach AED 25.20 billion in 1995, against AED 24.20 billion in 1994. Public consumption represented 17.5% of gross domestic product in 1995.

The value of fixed capital formation reached AED 38.33 billion, increasing by 2.7% above 1994 levels. This increase can be attributed to the role of the private sector in the establishment of small industries with the encouragement of the government through easy-term financing from the U.A.E. Industrial Bank. Variation in the inventory reached AED 2.20 billion, an increase of 10% above levels recorded in 1994.

The value of exports of goods and services grew by 7.1%, to reach AED 108.8 billion at the

end of 1995, against AED 101.6 billion in 1994. Meanwhile, the value of imports of goods and services reached AED 102.3 billion in 1995, increasing by 8.0% above levels recorded in 1994.

3. Labour and Population

The 1995 census indicates that the population reached 2.38 million in 1995, against 2.23 million estimated in 1994, registering a growth rate of 6.6%. Males constituted 66% of the population in 1995, while females constituted 34%.

Recent data on the number of workers in the U.A.E. shows that the total number of workers increased by 42 thousand (4.6%) above 1994 levels. Accordingly, the total number of workers in the U.A.E. reached 955 thousand in 1995, against 913 thousand in 1994. This increase was distributed among all sectors of the economy.

A review of the labour force by economic sectors, as shown in Table 2-5 below, indicates that the government and other services sector accounted for 30.1% of total workers. The trade

sector ranked second, with a total number of 174 thousand workers (18.2%). The number of workers in the construction sector reached 156 thousand workers, (16.4%) and in the industries sector 112 thousand workers (11.7%). The ratios of workers in other sectors ranged between 2.4% and 9.3% of the total number of workers.

4. Public Finance

The U.A.E. government continued, during 1995, to allocate substantial portions of its resources for the completion of the country's infrastructure, it being a major pre-requisite for further economic and social development. The government also continued to provide services to its citizens through sustained spending on the development of social, health and educational services, as well as housing.

The government also increased its public revenues by diversifying sources of income. Nevertheless, oil earnings continued to play a decisive role in determining the pace of

economic activity in the various sectors of the economy and remained the major source of public revenue for the government.

4.1. The Consolidated Account of U.A.E. Finance

Data on the consolidated account of the United Arab Emirates for the year 1995, show an increase in both public revenues and public expenditure. The increase in public revenues has mainly resulted from the rise in oil earnings, in addition to an increase in own revenues resulting from further increases to fees charged on services rendered by the government alongwith an increase in the custom tariffs of some commodities.

As a result of the increase in government spending, however, a deficit of AED 18.2 billion has been realized in the consolidated account in 1995, against an adjusted deficit of AED 16.1 billion in 1994. Part of the said deficit was financed through the banking system and the rest by returns from foreign investments.

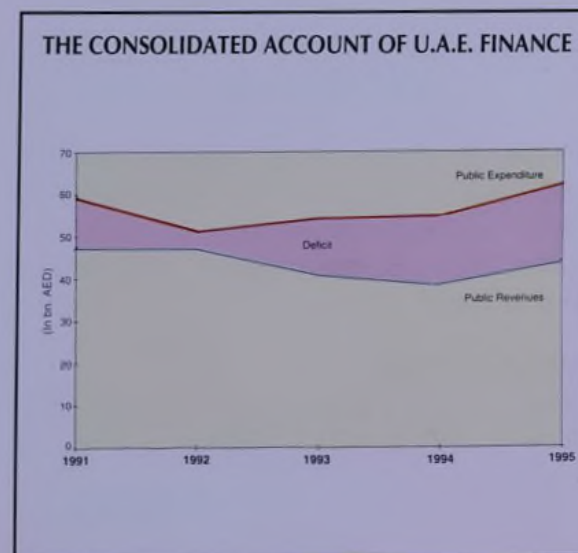

4.1.1 Public Revenues

Public revenues for the fiscal year 1995 have increased by AED 5.0 billion (12.9%) to reach AED 43.7 billion, compared to AED 38.7 billion in 1994.

- Oil revenues

Oil revenues rose by AED 3.3 billion (11.2%), to reach a total of AED 33.2 billion at the end of 1995, compared to AED 29.9 billion at the end of 1994. Such increase has resulted from the marked rise of oil prices in international markets as the weighted average price reached US\$ 16.64 a barrel in 1995, against US\$ 15.57 a barrel in 1994.

- Customs revenues

Customs revenues also increased from AED 0.6 billion in 1994 to AED 1.3 billion in 1995, an increase of AED 0.7 billion (120%). This increase resulted from a rise in custom duty on tobacco to 50% along with a fixed custom tariff

of 4% on most commodities at all Custom departments in the United Arab Emirates.

- Other revenues

Other revenues grew by AED 0.9 billion (11.3%) to reach AED 9.0 billion in 1995, against AED 8.1 billion in 1994. This was mainly due to increases in fees charged on services rendered by the government in the areas of health, water and electricity.

4.1.2 Public Expenditure

Public expenditure recorded a substantial increase, reaching AED 61.8 billion at the end of 1995, an increase of AED 7.0 billion (12.9%) compared to the 1994 level of AED 54.8 billion.

- Current Expenditure

Total current expenditure amounted to AED 43.6 billion in 1995, compared to AED 38.1 billion at the end of 1994, increasing by AED 5.5 billion (14.4%). Current expenditure constituted 70.5% of total public expenditure in 1995, compared to 69.5% in 1994.

- Development Expenditure

Development expenditure rose to AED 11.9 billion in 1995, against AED 11.7 billion in 1994, an increase of AED 208 million (1.8%).

- Equity Participations and Capital Payments

Equity participations and capital payments rose during the fiscal year 1995 to AED 6.3 billion, against AED 5.0 billion at the end of 1994, an increase of AED 1.3 billion (27.6%).

4.2 The Federal Government's Public Finance

4.2.1 Public Revenues

The 1995 account of the U.A.E. Federal Government, summarized in Table 2-7 below, reflects a slight increase in total public revenues compared to 1994 levels. The bulk of this

increase occurred in other revenues which grew by AED 443 million (12%) compared to 1994. This increase has mainly resulted from a new custom duty of 50% applied on tobacco products in addition to increases in charges for health, water and electricity services.

4.2.2 Public Expenditure

Public expenditures of the Federal Government amounted to AED 17.8 billion in the fiscal year 1995, against AED 15.9 billion at the end of 1994, registering an increase of AED 1.9 billion (12%) above 1994 levels. This increase was entirely concentrated in current expenditure.

- Current Expenditure

Current expenditure rose by AED 2.1 billion (13.9%) in 1995, to reach AED 17.3 billion, against AED 15.2 billion in 1994, forming 96.9% of total public expenditure at the end of 1995. This increase in current expenditure resulted from the retirement of some loans.

- Development Expenditure

Development expenditure decreased by AED 191 million in the fiscal year 1995, reaching AED 543 million in 1995, against AED 743.3 million in 1994.

- Equity Participations and Capital Payments

No equity participations or capital payments were recorded during 1995. This item equaled AED 1.4 million at the end of 1994.

The deficit in the Federal Government's budget reached AED 943 million in 1995, against a surplus of AED 547 million in 1994.

5. Monetary and Credit Policy

A. Dirham Exchange Rate Developments

In view of a Central Bank's policy, since 1980, of maintaining the dirham's rate of exchange fixed against the US dollar at an average rate of AED 3.671 for each dollar, developments in the dollar's exchange rate against other major currencies impact on the dirham's exchange rate against these currencies. Accordingly, the dirham depreciated, on average, against major non-dollar currencies during 1995 due to the depreciation of the US dollar. However, import substitution made possibly by international trade competition played a significant role in alleviating the price impact of the depreciation of the US dollar against other major currencies. Utilizing the flexibility of international market, the UAE trade sector obtained goods and services of comparable quality and competitive prices from various markets. As such, dollar depreciation did not fully impact on domestic prices of goods and services within the United Arab Emirates.

Compared to its average in 1994, the dirham exchange rate declined at the end of 1995 against most major non-dollar currencies, dropping by 13.6% against the Swiss franc, 11.7% against the Deutsche mark, 11.7% against the Netherlands guilder, 9.4% against the French franc, 8.3% against the Japanese yen and 2.8% against the Pound sterling.

The dirham's exchange rate also declined against the SDR by 5.6% in 1995, compared to 1994. The average rate of the SDR unit reached AED 5.5701 in 1995.

Against currencies of G.C.C. countries, the dirham depreciated by 0.1%, on average, against the Kuwaiti dinar, in 1995, compared to 1994. The dirham's rate of exchange against the remaining G.C.C. currencies remained unchanged.

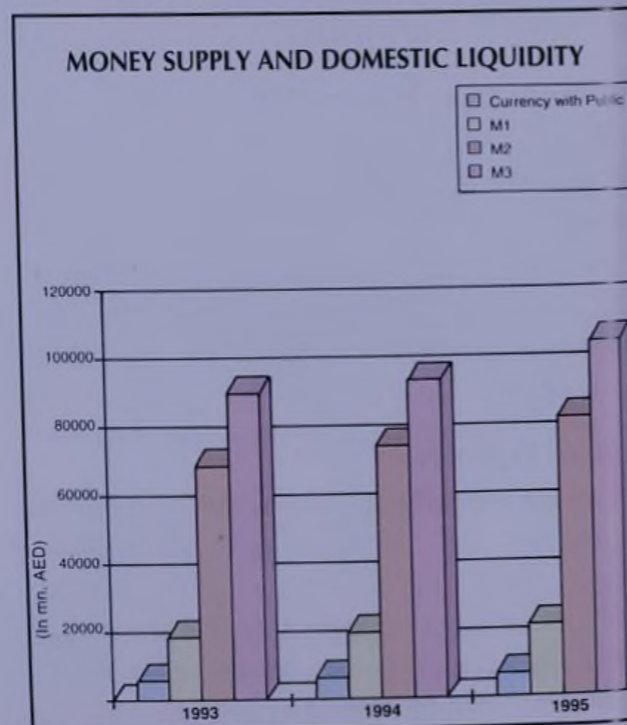

B. Monetary And Banking Indicators

B.1 Monetary Survey

In keeping with the development of economic activity, major monetary indicators rose in 1995. Money Supply (M1) increased by AED 1.64 billion (8.6%) to reach AED 20.82 billion by the end of 1995, compared to a level of AED 19.18 billion at the end of 1994. This rise occurred in both monetary deposits and currency with the public, as the former increased by AED 1.27 billion (9.6%) while the latter rose by AED 374 million (6.2%).



Private domestic liquidity (M2) grew by AED 7.52 billion (10.2%), reaching AED 81.40 billion. The said increase in private domestic liquidity (M2) was mainly attributed to the increase in money supply (M1) earlier mentioned, together with a rise of AED 5.88 billion (10.7%) in quasi-monetary deposits, which reached AED 60.58 billion.

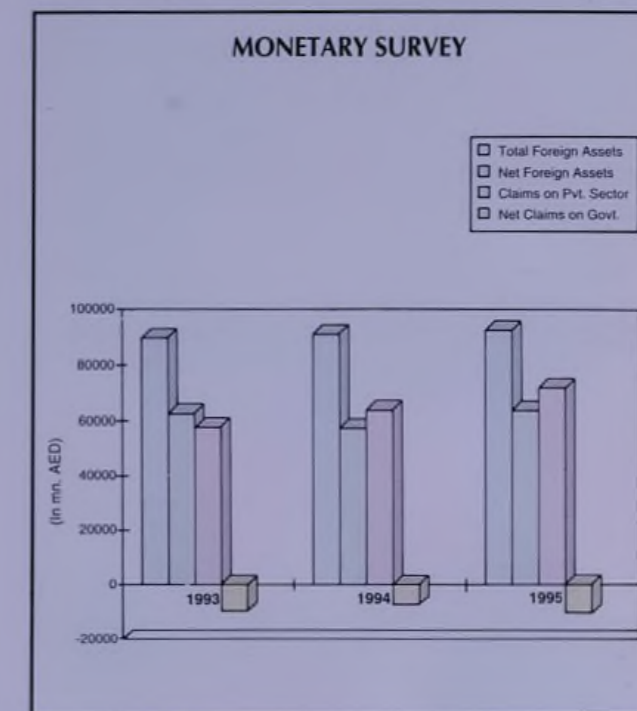

Overall liquidity (M3) grew by AED 10.59 billion (11.4%) to reach AED 103.49 billion at the end of 1995. This increase has resulted from the expansion of private domestic liquidity (M2) as indicated above, in addition to an increase of AED 3.07 billion (16.1%) in government deposits, which reached AED 22.09 billion at the end of 1995.

A review of the factors which impact private domestic liquidity (M2) shows that the effect of net foreign assets and net domestic credit were both expansionary, as they rose by AED 6.41 billion and AED 4.73 billion respectively. However, the net effect of other factors on

private domestic liquidity (M2) was contractionary by AED 3.63 billion.



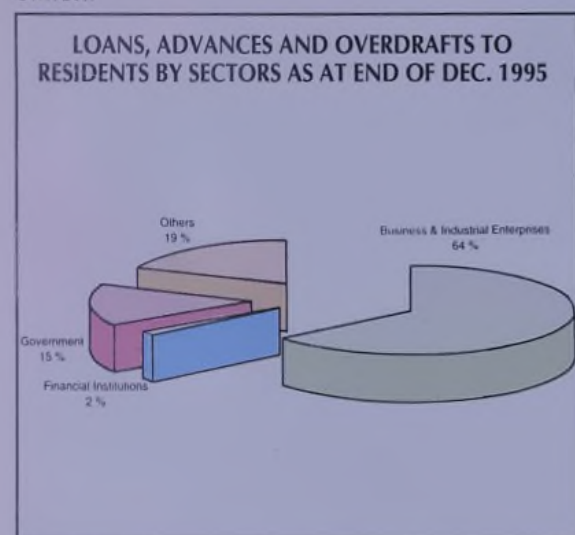
B-2 Banks Operating in the Country

The aggregated balance sheet of banks* has grown by AED 9.29 billion (5.4%), to reach AED 180.89 billion by the end of December 1995 against AED 171.60 billion at the end of December 1994.

Deposits and cash with the Central Bank item rose by AED 1.81 billion (17.4%) to reach AED 12.21 billion at the end of 1995.

Net foreign assets of commercial banks reached AED 35.98 billion at the end of December 1995, increasing by AED 3.64 billion (11.2%). This was the outcome of a larger decline in foreign liabilities than foreign assets. Foreign liabilities declined by AED 4.85 billion (14.6%), to reach AED 28.31 billion, against AED 33.16 billion at the end of 1994, while foreign assets decreased by AED 1.21 billion (1.9%) to reach AED 64.29 billion.

Credit extended increased by AED 8.26 billion (8.8%), to reach AED 102.01 billion, against an increase of AED 8.34 billion (9.8%) recorded in 1994. Growth in this item mainly occurred in credit extended to residents, which rose by AED 7.82 billion (9.3%) to equal AED 91.51 billion by the end of 1995. Meanwhile, credit extended to non-residents grew by AED 437 million (4.3%) to reach of AED 10.50 billion.



An analysis of the distribution of credit to residents according to type of facility shows that the increase in credit mainly occurred in loans, advances and overdrafts, which rose by AED 6.78 billion (8.8%). The bulk of this increase was in industrial and trading enterprises, as the balance of credit extended to these institutions rose by AED 4.69 billion, forming 64.3% of total loans, advances and overdrafts. Credit extended to the government formed 15.3% of the said total, increasing by AED 229 million (1.8%). Credit extended under "other", which includes, inter-alia, credit extended to individuals, rose by AED 2.06 billion (15.4%), while credit extended to financial institutions dropped by AED 201 million (11.4%).

Credit extended to residents in the form of real estate mortgage loans grew by AED 590 million (12.1%). Likewise, credit against discounted commercial bills rose by AED 447 million (22.8%).

An analysis of the distribution of domestic credit to residents according to economic activity indicates that credit extended to the trade sector rose by AED 2.72 billion (9.8%) reaching AED 30.40 billion by the end of 1995. Likewise, credit extended to the mining and industry sector increased by AED 1.43 billion (16.6%) and credit to the construction sector rose by AED 1.14 billion (8.1%). Credit extended to other activities rose by AED 2.56 billion (15.5%), while shares of the remaining economic sectors showed only slight variations.

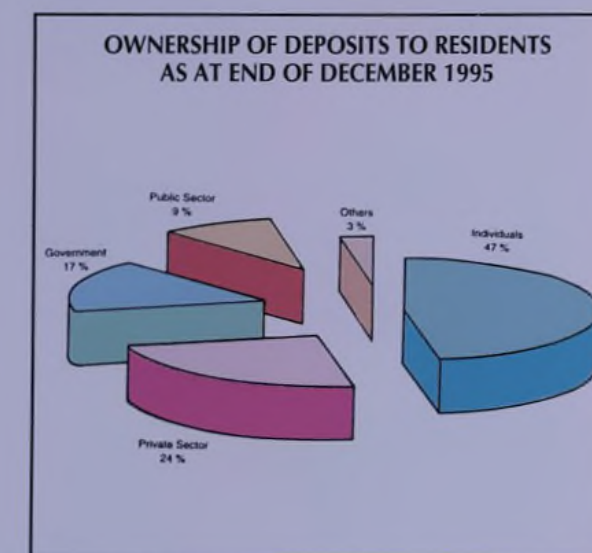
By the end of 1995, total deposits with banks operating in the country reached AED 93.01 billion, registering an increase by AED 10.05 billion (12.1%) compared to its level at the end of December 1994. This increase mainly occurred in residents deposits which rose by AED 9.70 billion (12.1%), while non-residents deposits grew by AED 348 million (13.1%).

Data on the distribution of residents deposits by ownership indicate that individual deposits formed 46.8% of total resident deposits at the end of 1995, while deposits of the private sector, which includes business, industries and financial institutions, formed 24.1%. Government deposits constituted 17%, while public sector commercial enterprises and other deposits formed 9.3% and 2.8% respectively.



Excluding government deposits and commercial guarantees, total deposits, classified according to type, reflect an increase in current deposits, by AED 1.52 billion (10.7%). Saving deposits rose by AED 382 million (5%) while time deposits increased by AED 5.33 billion (11.3%).

At the same time, distribution of private deposits according to type of currency shows that deposits in local currency increased, as at the end of 1995, by AED 7.15 billion (13.9%), while deposits in foreign currency rose by AED 80 million (0.4%). Accordingly, deposits in local currency accounted for 76.5% of total private deposits while deposits in foreign currency formed 23.5%.

An analysis of the bank's capital position at the end of 1995 shows that the total of the capital and reserve accounts reached AED 21.66 billion, an increase of AED 2.05 billion (10.5%) compared to 1994. Accordingly, the ratio of capital and reserves to total assets equaled 12% at year-end 1995.

Bank's net other liabilities rose by AED 1.96

billion (7.2%) to reach AED 29.12 billion at the end of 1995. This resulted from an increase of AED 2.62 billion (8.5%) in other liabilities, which reached AED 33.39 billion, and an increase of AED 659 million (18.3%) in other assets, which reached AED 4.27 billion at the end of 1995.

6. Inflation (Preliminary Estimates)

The 1995 preliminary estimate of average prices in the U.A.E. indicate an upward trend, compared to levels recorded in 1994.

The transportation and communication category registered a marked price increase due to increases in the price of automobiles and insurance. Likewise, furniture and furnishings items recorded an increase mainly as a result of a substantial increase in the price of wooden furniture and electrical appliances. Over the same period, price increases among rent, fuel and other energy items mainly resulted from increased charges for accommodations and electricity consumption. Meanwhile, prices of other commodity groups recorded only slight increases compared to levels recorded last year.

In view of the foregoing indicators, and taking into account the ratio of the group of services to the general average of prices, together with the ratio of imported consumer goods to total imports and changes in the dirhams exchange rate against currencies of the U.A.E.'s major trade partners, the average increase in U.A.E. prices may be estimated to have ranged between 4% and 5% during 1995, compared to the previous year.

7. The Balance of Payments and Foreign Trade

Preliminary estimates of the U.A.E. balance of payments indicates that an overall surplus of AED 2.8 billion was recorded within the balance of payments in 1995, an increase of 17.8% compared to 1994.

Within the current account, an increase of 23.5% was recorded in the surplus during 1995. This occurred despite a decline in the trade surplus and is primarily attributable to a net increase in service income.

The trade balance declined from AED 17.2 billion in 1994 to AED 16.9 billion in 1995 as a result of an increase in value of imports through the Jebel Ali Free Zone*. Imports through the Jebel Ali Free Zone amounted to AED 8.4 billion in 1995, compared to AED 5.3 billion in 1994. The total value of U.A.E. imports amounted to AED 86.2 billion in 1995, against AED 83.3 billion in 1994, an increase of 3.5%.

The value of oil exports rose by 6.7% in 1995, increasing from AED 41.8 billion in 1994 to AED 44.6 billion in 1995. This was due to an increase in average oil prices in 1995. The value of exports of gas also increased during 1995, rising from AED 5.1 billion in 1994 to AED 5.5 billion in 1995. This was due to a rise in the average price of gas driven by the rise in oil prices and from an increase in the productive output of the liquefied gas factory on "Das" island.

The value of other exports and re-exports recorded an increase of 5.7%, reaching AED

13.3 billion in 1995. The increase in the value of other exports is mainly attributed to a rise in the price of products derived from petroleum due to the increase in average oil prices during 1995.

Consumer goods formed 53% of the total value of imports in 1995 while capital goods accounted for 36%. During 1995, approximately 45% of imports originated from Asian countries, 39% from European countries and 10% from American countries.

Net service items, representing an estimate of investment income and transfers from other items, including travel, tourism and government services, rose by 49.8% to equal AED 9.38 billion in 1995. This primarily resulted from an increase of 27.5% in the estimate of investment income during 1995.

At the same time, net transfers rose slightly in 1995 to AED 12.4 billion (0.9%). Compared to levels recorded in 1994, worker remittances increased while official grants decreased slightly during 1995.

Within the capital account, movements in short-term capital indicated an outflow of AED 3.6 billion in 1995, against an inflow of AED 7.44 billion recorded in 1994. Moreover, the item of government institutions, private capital flow and net errors and omissions is estimated to have recorded an outflow of AED 7.4 billion, hence, bringing about a net deficit of nearly AED 11 billion in the capital account.

Dubai Commerce and Tourism Promotion Board

Annual Review 1995

During 1995, the Dubai Commerce and Tourism Promotion Board (DCTPB) continued to build and develop its activities in promoting Dubai in the international market.

Among the more significant achievements of the year were:-

Organisation and Structure

The first major expansion of the DCTPB's overseas office network since 1990 saw the establishment of representation in Moscow, covering the Russian Federation, and Johannesburg and Nairobi, covering Southern and Eastern Africa.

The existing UK operation was upgraded from a consultancy to a fully-fledged office, a new consultancy partner was taken on to operate the Far East Office and a new Director was appointed in France Office.

Overseas Promotions

The marketing activities of the DCTPB's overseas offices actively contributed to the growth in the number of international tour operators promoting Dubai and to the accelerated inflow of businesses setting up operations in the emirate.

International trade fair participation was increased from 26 in 1994 to 34 in 1995, including events in new markets such as Sweden and Singapore. Larger stands were required to accommodate the demand from the tourism community (at one major event no less than 34 Dubai organisations joined the DCTPB stand).

An important new initiative extended the DCTPB's commerce activities from the promotion of inward investment to include support for local exporters and re-exporters including the organisation of private sector delegations at trade fairs in the CIS, East Africa and South Africa.

Dubai Promotions

Some 236 inward missions were organised and assisted during the year, including programme arrangements, tours, interviews, hospitality and briefings. The emphasis on TV crews and other media generated substantial positive publicity for Dubai around the world.

The DCTPB extended its collaboration with other Dubai bodies in the organisation of support for major local events such as the Dubai Shopping Festival, Emirates International Forum, Dubai 95, Dubai Desert Classic etc. Steps were taken to increase the DCTPB's local information services at the Dubai World Trade Centre and other venues.

Information and Media

The DCTPB diversified its promotional media by going on-line with the Internet. New, revised or upgraded publicity and information materials included "Reflections of Dubai" (photographic study), "Dubai Business Handbook", "Destination Dubai", "Dubai Means Business" video etc, while the range of languages was extended to include Swedish and Norwegian.

In advertising, key developments included increased use of consumer media to promote tourism internationally and an extension of

PROGRESS REPORT FOR WORK CARRIED OUT UNDER THE CONTROL OF MONTGOMERY WATSON (FORMERLY WATSON HAWKSLEY) FOR THE YEAR 1995.

Expenditure on the development of the sewerage system, the stormwater drainage system and irrigation network was Dirhams 35.0 million. This represented an increase when compared to the previous year's expenditure (Dhs. 27.8 million) and it does not include for work done through other consultants.

Construction commenced in April 1994 on the storm water/ground water drainage scheme to serve Al Regga and Al Muteena districts. The contract valued at Dhs. 38 million is making use of microtunnelling techniques to minimise traffic

disruption in this busy commercial and residential area. Completion originally scheduled for the end of 1995 is now due for mid October 1996.

The first rehabilitation contract, value Dhs. 21 million, for the rehabilitation of sewerage in the Al Ras area of Dubai commenced in mid 1994. The project is now anticipated to be completed by November 1996.

A second rehabilitation contract, value Dhs. 42.5 million, for the rehabilitation of sewage in yet another part of Deira commenced mid March 1995. Completion is scheduled for March 1997. On completion of these two contracts the reconstructed network will have the additional capacity to serve the new developments and increasing population in this sector of the city. Maximum use is being made of non-disruptive excavation techniques to minimise interruption to traffic and commercial activity.

Design work recommenced on the Al Garhoud sewerage and drainage scheme taking into account the new road system now under construction between Al Garhoud bridge and Airport road was completed and was ready to go out for tender in early 1996. The value of the project was estimated to be Dhs. 33.2 million.

Work continued on the provision of new house and building connections and the execution of minor and emergency works throughout the City.

- (iv) to study applications to construct plant/factories and applications for expanding the same, and to decide on these in the light of their economic feasibility;
- (v) to regulate and encourage the marketing of the Emirate's industrial products;
- (vi) to encourage the investment of national and foreign capital in commercial and industrial projects and to secure the appropriate climate for such investment;
- (vii) to organize exhibitions in cooperation with the concerned parties;
- (viii) to control insurance business and supervise insurance companies operating in the Emirate;
- (ix) to supervise the incorporation of companies of whatever nature and to register and control national and foreign companies, and to study the participation of the government in companies and development projects and to represent the government in companies where the government has stake;
- (x) to regulate and control the practising of the auditing profession;
- (xi) to coordinate and cooperate with federal government departments in the implementation of federal laws relating to trade and industry and other economic activities, on the basis that the Department is the concerned party in the Emirate with regard to the implementation of those laws; and
- (xii) any other business related to the jurisdiction of the Department listed in the first paragraph of this Article.

In the year 1959, H.H. Shaikh Rashid Bin Sa'id Al Maktoum, the late Ruler of Dubai, initiated the creation of Dubai Electricity Company (now known as Dubai Electricity & Water Authority) to meet the growing requirements of Dubai which until then had been relying upon privately owned generators supplying electricity to a limited number of houses. The Authority supplied electricity to its first Consumer on July 23, 1961.

The phenomenal growth of the Authority can be seen from the statistics given below:

From the beginning of 1961 up to 1968, the generation and transmission voltage was 6.6 kV. The 33 kV transmission system was first introduced in 1969 and this was the primary transmission voltage until 1977. During the year

1978, the 132 kV transmission lines and substations were introduced in the system. During 1993, the 400 kV transmission lines and substations were introduced in the system.

Dubai Electricity & Water Authority (DEWA) started supplying electricity from the Jebel Ali Power and Desalination Station (Station 'D') to the system from February 10, 1979 and started supplying water to Water Division (the then Dubai Water Department) from June 5, 1979. The Jebel Ali Power and Desalination Stations (Stations 'D', 'E' and 'G') form the main source of power and water supply to the Emirate of Dubai.

II. SYSTEM OPERATION STATISTICS 1995 :

System peak load recorded during 1995 was 1462.00 MW as compared to 1393.00 MW during the previous year, a growth of 4.95%.

III. GENERATION:

A. Generation & Desalination Plant Capability - End 1995

DEWA at present operates four power stations. One of these is the Satwa Gas Turbine Power Station (Station 'C') located near Port Rashid, Dubai, the second is the Jebel Ali Power and Desalination Station (Station 'D'), the third is the Jebel Ali Gas Turbine & Desalination Station 'E' and the fourth is the Jebel Ali Gas Turbine & MSF Desalination Station 'G', which are located at Jebel Ali. Given below is some brief information on the power stations:

Satwa Gas Turbine Power Station (Station 'C')

This Station is located near Port Rashid, Dubai

7,525.22 million units compared to 7,093.31 million units in the previous year, a growth of 6.09%. During the year a nett energy of 3.05 million units was imported from Dubal.

The total number of electricity consumers, excluding consumers under the process of deletion, as at end of the year 1995 was 158,350 compared to 149,971 as at the end of the year 1994, a growth of 5.59%.

Water supplied from DEWA's Desalination Plants at Jebel Ali during the year 1995 was 27,748 million imperial gallons as compared with 25,002 million imperial gallons during 1994, an increase of 10.98%.

and was built in stages between the years 1974 and 1978. It consists of 16 simple cycle gas turbine generators of sizes ranging from summer firm site rating of 9 MW to 40 MW. The total summer firm capability of this Station is 320 MW. This Station can operate only on diesel oil. Since diesel oil is expensive, it is not economical to generate power at 'C' Station and hence kept as emergency standby.

Jebel Ali Power and Desalination Station (Station 'D')

This station is located on the Shaikh Zayed Road about 35 kilometres from Dubai along the sea coast. Phase I of the steam station was built between the years 1976 and 1980. It consists of

steam turbine generating plants each of 68 MW capacity and 5 multi stage flash desalination plants each of 2.86 million imperial gallons daily associated with the steam turbines. Thus Phase I has a capability of 340 MW of power and 14.30 million imperial gallons daily of water.

During the years 1982 and 1983, two gas turbine generators each with a summer site rating of 42.50 MW was added at the Jebel Ali Power and Desalination Station (Station 'D').

Phase II of the Steam Station was built between the years 1981 and 1984. It consists of 3 steam turbine generating plants each of 75 MW capacity and 3 multi stage flash desalination plants each of 5.72 million imperial gallons daily associated with the steam turbines. Thus Phase II has a capability of 225 MW of power and 17.16 million imperial gallons daily of water.

Thus the total installed capacity at Jebel Ali Power and Desalination Station (Station 'D') is 650 MW of power and 31.46 million imperial gallons daily of water.

Jebel Ali Gas Turbine and Desalination Station 'E'

The contract for the construction of a Gas Turbine and Desalination Station 'E', next to the existing Power and Desalination Station (Station 'D') at Jebel Ali was awarded in February 1986. Station 'E' consists of 3 gas turbine generating plants each of 84 MW capacity (Gross) at 50 degrees centigrade ambient temperature and 4 multi stage flash desalination plants each of 6 million imperial gallons daily associated with the gas turbines.

All the gas turbines are in commercial operation from July/August 1989. The first two desalination plants are in commercial operation since end August 1991 and the last two since end October 1991.

The contract for the construction of a new Gas Turbine Generating Station at Jebel Ali as an extension to the existing Jebel Ali Gas Turbine & Desalination Station 'E' was awarded in December 1990. The Station 'E' extension consists of 2 simple cycle gas turbine generating plants with a total site summer power output of around 180 MW (Gross). The first gas turbine was completed and taken over in June 1992 followed by the second in July 1992.

Jebel Ali Gas Turbine & MSF Desalination Station 'G'

The contract for the construction of a new Gas Turbine and MSF Desalination Station 'G' at Jebel Ali adjacent to the Jebel Ali Gas Turbine and Desalination Station 'E' extension was awarded in May 1991. This station will have a total site summer output of around 457 MW (gross) and a total multi stage flash desalination plant output of around 60 million imperial gallons per day. The first two gas turbines were taken over in October 1993 and the last two in January 1994.

The second block of four desalination plants were taken over in June 1994 followed by the first block of four desalination plants in October 1994.

B. Generation Plant under Construction

Jebel Ali Power Station 'E' Extension Phase III

The contract for the combined cycle conversion of two existing simple cycle gas turbines at Station 'E' was awarded in February 1994. The plant will have two heat recovery steam generators and a steam turbine of around 112 MW (Gross) capacity. The plant is scheduled to be commissioned by early 1996.

Addition of Fifth Gas Turbine and Fifth Waste Heat Recovery Boiler at Jebel Ali 'G' Station and Addition of Back Pressure Steam Turbines at Jebel Ali 'E' and 'G' Stations.

The contract for the above projects was awarded in February 1995. The fifth gas turbine will have a capacity of around 120 MW (Gross) at 50 deg. C. ambient temperature. The Back Pressure Steam Turbine project consists of addition of single Back Pressure Steam Turbine of around 58 MW (Gross) capacity at Station 'E' and two numbers Back Pressure Steam Turbines each of around 71 MW (Gross) capacity at 'G' Station. The fifth Gas

Turbine is scheduled for completion before summer 1996. The Back Pressure Steam Turbines at 'E' and 'G' Stations are scheduled for completion before summer 1997.

C. Future Generator Plant Additions Planned

Aweer Gas Turbine Power Station 'H'

The contract for the construction of a peak lopping Gas Turbine Power Station of around 600 MW installed capacity at Aweer is likely to be awarded during early 1996. The plants are scheduled to be commissioned in stages between May 1997 and February 1998. A 400 kV substation will also be constructed at Aweer Power Station including 400 kV transmission line connections to the existing 400 kV system.

IV. TRANSMISSION AND DISTRIBUTION - ELECTRICITY

A. System at present

The Dubai Electricity System consists of transmission at 132 kV and 400 kV, primary distribution at 33 kV, secondary distribution at

6.6 kV and 380 volts. New developing areas such as Jebel Ali, Habab and Lusaily have secondary distribution at 11 kV instead of 6.6 kV. Given below is some brief information on the Transmission and Distribution System as at the end of 1995. The figures for overhead lines and underground cables represent the route lengths involved.

400 kV System

The system has 3 substations with a total of 8 transformers and a total transformation capacity of 3300 MVA. There are in all 86 kilometres of overhead lines.

132 kV System

The system has 16 substations and a transformer feeder, with a total of 37 transformers and a total transformation capacity of 2845 MVA. There are in all 513 kilometres of overhead lines and 71 kilometres of underground cables.

33 kV System

The system has 141 substations with a total of 311 transformers and a total transformation capacity of 3215 MVA.

During the year 1995, 10 substations were added. The number of transformers increased by 32 and the transformation capacity increased by 390 MVA.

As at the end of the year 1995, there were in all 195 33 kV circuits with a total of 160 kilometres of overhead lines and 765 kilometres of underground cables.

6.6 kV and 11 kV System

The system has in all 4282 substations with a total transformation capacity of 4393.5 MVA. Of these, 414 were added during the year 1995 with a transformation capacity of 617.5 MVA. The total number of feeders are 1128, of these 61

were added during 1995.

Number of Electricity Consumers

As at the end of the year 1995 there were in all 158,350 consumers, excluding consumers under the process of deletion. There were around 50,000 commercial consumers and around 108,000 non-commercial consumers. During the year 1995, nett addition of 8,379 consumers was made.

Approximately 38% of the energy sold was consumed by the commercial consumers and 62% of the energy sold by non-commercial consumers.

B. Transmission and Distribution Projects Completed/under Construction

The contract for the construction of Aweer - Hatta 132 kV double circuit overhead line and for the construction of 132 kV Substations one each at Aweer and Hatta were awarded in January 1994 and have since been completed. The Hatta Power System was integrated with the Dubai Power System Network in November 1995.

The construction work on the addition of second 132/11 kV inter bus transformer at Central Military Command Substation was completed and was commissioned on April 16, 1995.

The contract for supply, installation and commissioning of 132 kV overhead line and cables between Mushriff and Garhoud was awarded in December 1994 and the work is in the final stage of completion.

The installation and commissioning of 33 kV capacitor banks at 'B' Station, Heavy Industries,

Mushriff and Garhoud 132/33 kV Substations was completed by November 1995.

The contract for supply, installation and commissioning of 132/11 kV Substations one each at Rigga Al Buteen, Al Quoz and Jebel Ali Free Zone Authority was awarded in March 1994. These are scheduled for completion by April, 1996.

The contract for supply, installation and commissioning of 132/11 kV Substations one each near Holiday Centre and Chicago Beach Hotel was awarded in November 1994 and these are scheduled for completion by early 1996.

The installation work of Live Line Washing Equipment at 400 kV substation at 'G' station, Najma and Mushriff was completed during April 1995.

The contract for new 132 kV substation at Najma was awarded on October 1995. This is scheduled for completion by end 1996.

C. Future Transmission and Distribution Projects Planned

Tenders for supply, installation and commissioning of 132/11 kV substations at Port Saeed and Raffa have been received. These are under final stages of evaluation.

Tenders for supply, installation and commissioning of 400 kV overhead line from 'G' station - Sharjah Boarder - 'H' Station, Extension of 400 kV 'G' station substation and upgrading of 2 existing 132 kV substations have been received. These are under final stages of evaluation.

WATER DIVISION

V. TRANSMISSION AND DISTRIBUTION - WATER

A. Water Network Restitution Projects

Contract RC2 (Phase II) for Deira side

The contract for rehabilitation of water network in order to extend its service life, maintenance of the network, valves, meters and service supply lines to the premises of the consumers was awarded in March 1993. This project was completed during January 1995.

B. Water Reservoir

Presently there are two water reservoirs, one at Jebel Ali (30 MIG) and the other at Rashidiya (12 MIG). In order to augment the water storage capacity, a contract for the construction of the additional water reservoir at Mushriff of 60 MIG capacity was awarded in June 1993 and was completed during June 1995.

The contract for the construction of an additional water reservoir of 10 MIG capacity adjacent to the existing Jebel Ali reservoir was awarded in February 1994. This work was completed during June, 1995.

C. Water Pipelines

i) Contract CW/293/93 - Installation of 1200 MM Transmission Pipeline to connect Mushriff and Jebel Ali Reservoirs with the Main Network

This contract was awarded in April 1994 and the work on Phase I, i.e. the pipeline to Mushriff reservoir was commissioned in time to supply water for testing of the Mushriff reservoir structure. The work on phase II at Jebel Ali end was completed during May, 1995.

ii) Contract CW/217/95 - Laying of 600mm & 900mm diameter Transmission Main in Various Locations in Dubai

The contract for laying of 600 mm & 900 mm diameter transmission main in various locations

in Dubai to reinforce the existing transmission system within the city, was awarded during October, 1995. This is schedule for completion by September 1996.

iii) Contract CW/218/95 - Supply, Installation, Testing and Commissioning of 1200mm dia Transmission Main from Najma Booster Station to Mushrif Reservoir Complex and Refurbishment of Existing Transmission Mains

This contract was awarded in October 1995 and is scheduled for completion by November 1996.

D. Future Projects Planned

i) Contract CW/226/94 (SCADA)

The contract for the engineering consultancy services for SCADA (Supervisory Control And Data Aquisition System) has been awarded to M/s. PARSONS ENGG. SCIENCE, INC. Preliminary Study Report is expected to be submitted by March, 1996.

ii) Contract CW/360/95 - Excavation, Laying, Testing, Commissioning & Backfilling of Distribution A.C. Pipelines and Service Pipe (LDPE)

The tenders for this project have been received and are under final stages of evaluation.

iii) Contract CNW/346/95 (RC3) - Network Restitution Works

The tenders received for the above project are under evaluation and the contract is expected to be awarded by March, 1996.

E. Details of Pipelines laid

During the year 1995, around 25.54 kilometres

of transmission pipelines of diameter 22" and above were laid and commissioned. Around 38.56 kilometres of distribution pipelines below 22" diameter were also laid and commissioned.

F. Water Supply to Dubai

The total quantity of water supplied to Dubai during the year 1995 was 29,836 million imperial gallons as compared with 29,130 million imperial gallons during 1994, representing an increase of 2.40% in water demand.

G. House Connections

Total connections carried out up to December 1994 : 146,482

Total connections carried out during 1995 : 10,528

Total connections carried out up to December 1995 : 157,010

VI. SUPERVISORY CONTROL AND DATA ACQUISITION SYSTEM (SCADA)

A System Control Centre was established during 1982 at Mushriff for performing supervisory control and monitoring of power system operation. The system is called Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition or in short SCADA. Initially only the 132 kV substations were on supervisory control. The secondary transmission (33 kV) was monitored and controlled by SCADA, only through the outgoing 33 kV feeders of the ten 132/33 kV substations.

The Supervisory Control System was further expanded to directly monitor and control all the 132 kV and 33 kV substations spread over Deira, Dubai, Jebel Ali and Habab areas. Supervisory control of all the 132 kV network and most of the 33 kV network and monitoring of the generation

are the major functions of this system. As of now, all the 400 kV/132 kV substations (17 Nos.) and 33 kV distribution substations (120 Nos.) are on SCADA control. All the four generating stations are being monitored by SCADA.

The heart of the control system is the process computer. The System Control Engineer can communicate with the Computer System and the Power System through the operator's desk equipped with video display units, alphanumeric keyboards, technological keyboard and joy sticks. The extensive use of SCADA System for the past 13 years has resulted in improved reliability and quality of service to electricity consumers.

Due to depleted response of the existing SCADA system (Siemens) a Mini SCADA system was commissioned to take care of further expansions in high voltage network, pending commissioning of new upgraded SCADA System.

SCADA/ENERGY MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

It is planned to enhance the SCADA System further into a full fledged Energy Management System (EMS) with the latest technology available in the fields of computer hardware, software, Data base and Information Technology. A contract has been awarded in April 1995 for the above upgradation. The scope of the above contract includes the following:

- An Interim SCADA Upgrade :

Under this scheme the existing Siemens SCADA Master Station at System Control Centre at Mushriff will be replaced by a network of most up to date DEC-ALPHA computers, provided with a proprietary SCADA/EMS software known as 'RANGER'. This system is expected to be

commissioned by mid 1996.

- A Backbone Data Highway :

A dual redundant data communication ring based on Fibre-Optic network to ensure reliable data communication for the SCADA/EMS system.

- A new System Control Centre at Najma :

The new System Control Centre will be established in a new building at Najma complex. This will have a more extensive computer network with individual servers for System Control, Data Acquisition, Dispatchers Training Simulator and five Consoles. This will have all the programmes for power system analysis like Load Flow, Fault Studies, Generation/Commitment Schedules, Contingency Analysis etc. This system is expected to be commissioned by mid 1997.

- Modification of Existing 33/11-6.6 kV Substations :

About 130 existing distribution substations will be modified for direct supervisory control from System Control Centre at Najma.

VI. CONCLUSION

Dubai Electricity & Water Authority's objective is to provide high quality service by way of adequate, reliable and uninterrupted supply of electricity and water to consumers, adopting cost effective systems, ensuring optimum utilization of available resources, always planning ahead so that sufficient capacities/facilities are available for the generation of power, production of potable water, and for their transmission and distribution to meet the ever growing demands of the Emirate simultaneously making sure that all operations are carried out efficiently and economically.

HATTA POWER SYSTEM

(A separate network in Wadi Hatta Enclave) Annual Report 1995

A. System at present

Hatta Electricity System was taken over by Dubai Electricity & Water Authority on June 1, 1979 upon the orders of H.H. Shaikh Rashid Bin Sa'id Al Maktoum.

At the time of take over Hatta had 4 diesel engine generators with a total installed capacity of 2.56 MW. The primary distribution was 6.6 kV and secondary distribution was 380 volts. There were in all 224 consumers.

A mobile gas turbine generator of 0.90 MW summer site rating was added in June 1980. During 1980 a new Power Station was built incorporating the old diesel engine generators and two new 2.00 MW diesel engine generators. New fuel oil tanks, switchgears and roads were added.

The primary distribution voltage at Hatta was fully converted to 11 kV in June 1981. The third 2.00 MW diesel engine generator was commissioned in March 1983.

In order to augment the installed capacity and to cater for the growth at Hatta, diesel engine generator sets were shifted from the old Jebel Ali Village Power Station to Hatta Power Station and were commissioned. Two 2 MW sets were shifted to Hatta and commissioned during June 1988, one 2 MW set in May 1989 and one 1 MW set in December 1992.

Total installed capacity of Hatta at the end of 1995 is 14.70 MW.

The existing Diesel Generator Power Station at Hatta can operate only on diesel oil which is expensive. Thus the electricity produced at this station is costly. Hence in order to interconnect the Hatta Power System with Dubai Power System Network, the contract for the construction of Aweer - Hatta 132 kV double circuit overhead line and for the construction of 132 kV substation one each at Aweer and Hatta was awarded in January 1994 and have since been completed. The Hatta Power System has been integrated with Dubai System network as on November 03, 1995. As a result Hatta Power Station has been kept as emergency standby.

During the year 1995 the maximum demand recorded was 10.65 MW, which represents an increase of 1.19% over the previous year. The total generation for the period January 01, 1995 to November 02, 1995 was 41.32 million units.

At the end of 1995 there were in all 1300 consumers compared to 1265 consumers at the beginning of the year.

At the end of 1995 there were 59 11kV substation transformers and 107 pole mounted transformers.

Dubai Petroleum Company Annual Review 1995

Dubai Petroleum Company operates four offshore fields on behalf of the Government of Dubai. The four fields are the Fateh, Southwest Fateh, Falah and Rashid fields.

The following is a summary of the four oil fields and significant projects that were undertaken in 1995.

Fateh Field

Fateh is the largest and the oldest of the four DPC oil fields. His Highness the late Sheikh Rashid bin Sa'id Al Maktoum personally named the field when it was discovered in 1966. "Fateh" in Arabic means "good fortune".

The Field has been continuously developed since its discovery. It currently has 178 active wells, 3 observation wells for the Enhanced Oil Recovery (EOR) pilot, and one gas producer. Fateh also has processing facilities, gas lift compression facilities with a capacity of 574 million standard cubic feet of gas per day (MMSCFPD), 156 miles of gathering and distribution lines, and 46 miles of power and communication cable. It also has a waterflood facility, with water injection capacity of 570,000 barrels of water per day (BWPD), and 2,240,000 barrels of oil storage capacity including the unique underwater storage vessels called "Khazzans".

In 1995, the Fateh Produced Water Treating Expansion, and several other maintenance, safety and facility enhancement projects were undertaken.

During 1995, 8 wells were drilled and completed in the Fateh Field.

Southwest Fateh Field

The second largest DPC oil field, Southwest Fateh, was discovered in November 1970. October 16, 1972 marked the date of first production from Southwest Fateh. The field has 126 active wells, gas lift compression facilities with 575 MMSCFPD capacity, 102 miles of gathering and distribution lines, and 29 miles of power and communication cable. It also has a waterflood facility, with water injection capacity of 480,000 BWPD. Oil production is transferred by pipeline to the Fateh Field for storage and export.

Falah Field

The field was discovered in 1972 and began producing in 1978. The field currently has 53 active wells, pipeline compression facilities with 87 MMSCFPD capacity, 37 miles of oil, gas and water pipelines and 6 miles of power and communication cables.

The Falah D development project, which began in 1993, continued during 1995. This development is the first in the world to exclusively utilize horizontal oil producers and water injectors. As part of this project, the wells Falah D-7, 8, and 9 were drilled and completed in 1995.

Also in 1995, four horizontal wells were completed in the Falah B development. As a result, the two producer wells increased production from Falah B significantly. Adding to the producer's success, the Falah B15 injector set a Gulf record for its size for the longest horizontal drilled.

Rashid Field

The smallest of DPC's four fields, Rashid Field, was discovered in 1973 and began production on March 1, 1979. The single DPC production platform has eight wells (five are DPC oil wells of which four are active, and three are DUGAS gas wells), gas lift compression facilities with 12 MMSCFPD capacity, and eighteen miles of oil pipelines.

3 DIMENSIONAL SEISMIC DATA COLLECTION

3-D seismic data processing was completed in August 1995. Interpretation of the data is continuing, but has already optimized and guided the drilling of four development wells in Fateh field and identified new opportunities within both Fateh and Southwest Fateh fields.

ENHANCED OIL RECOVERY PILOT PROJECT

In 1993, DPC initiated a miscible gas flood pilot project in the Fateh Field. The pilot will evaluate the feasibility of operating a gas flood on a larger scale. The pilot continued throughout 1995 and will continue into 1996.

GENERAL

At the end of 1995, DPC's manpower totalled 799.

Dubai Petroleum Company looks forward to its continued participation in the progress and development of Dubai and to a bright future under the wise and benevolent leadership of His Highness Sheikh Maktoum bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice President and Prime Minister of the United Arab Emirates and Ruler of Dubai.

SAFETY, HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENT

It is our first priority to provide a work place free of hazards and to maintain an environment in which our employees may function with minimal risk of injury or illness. It is also our policy to operate in a manner which minimizes any adverse impact on the natural environment of Dubai. DPC is continually seeking ways to improve in each of these areas. A "systems" approach is being used to manage SHE issues ranging from work practices to waste management.

A significant enhancement to DPC's safety health and environmental programme, this year has been in the area of emergency preparedness. Supported by a long history training and drills, our level of preparedness for emergency incidents has been upgraded by the implementation of a common incident management system called ICS, the upgrading of our on-site emergency operations center, and finally, by an upgrade of facilities used for training employees in fire fighting, breathing apparatus and other emergency and safety related techniques.

SAFETY AND OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH

1995 was statistically our best year on record in several of the incident categories regularly tracked. There were ZERO recordable injuries to any DPC employee. There were 1.8 million man-hours worked by DPC employees in 1995 and it has now been just over 3.1 million man-hours since our last DPC lost time injury. This represents the first time this significant accomplishment of zero recordable injuries to company personnel has been achieved.

Contractors worked 2.8 million man-hours in 1995, experiencing two lost time injuries and 17 recordable cases. These results equate to a Lost

Workday Case Rate of 0.14 (incidents per 200,000 hours) and Total Recordable Case Rate of 1.22 (incidents per 200,000 hours). This year's contractor performance was statistically similar to last year, and remains an area for future focus.

As a result of four responsible (preventable) motor vehicle accidents this year involving DPC vehicles, we had a incident rate of 3.37 incidents per million driven miles. This was a significant decline in performance compared to last years rate of 1.78 incidents per million miles driven.

ENVIRONMENTAL

In the environmental area, significant attention continued in the area of waste minimization. Larger and larger percentages of office and offshore refuse are finding their way into our recycling programme. Overboard water quality continues to be fine-tuned, following last year's system upgrades. Finally, work has begun on the development of a comprehensive waste management plan to address and document current and future waste management issues.

Dubai Natural Gas Company Limited (DUGAS)

Annual Report 1995

The Dubai Natural Gas Company is engaged in the gathering of natural gas off the coast of Dubai, and from onshore fields, transporting the gas to its onshore plant site at Jebel Ali and then processing it for separation into liquid products and residue gas. The liquid products are primarily exported to the world market, although a small percentage is utilized to supply the local market for bottled gas. The residue gas is employed to fuel local industrial power users. Sweet dry fuel gas is sent offshore to provide the fuel requirements of DPC and DUGAS production platforms. Since commencement of the plant operations in April 1980, various expansion projects have been implemented, yielding an increase in production of 40 to 50%.

DUGAS' residue gas is a vital factor in Dubai's production of aluminum as it is used to fuel gas turbines which drive the generators to produce electricity for the Dubai Aluminum smelter. The complex has not only increased the quantity of Dubai's export of petroleum products to world markets, but it has created new jobs, helped Dubai to achieve a greater level of prosperity, and at the same time provided additional

revenue for the Government. The construction of a sulphur recovery plant was completed at the end of 1992, allowing a high sulphur content gas stream to be processed while decreasing toxic emissions and enhancing the commercial value of the gas.

DUGAS has completed the construction of the MTBE plant which came on stream in February 1995. MTBE (methyl-tertiary butyl ether) is an additive for unleaded gasoline, raising the octane level and providing oxygen for more complete, cleaner combustion. With world-wide legislation for lead-free, environmentally sound fuels increasing, MTBE is a product of growing importance. This plant is Dubai's first petrochemical facility.

The development and continued expansion of DUGAS' training programme for Dubai Nationals is an outcome of the Government's long range plan to use more of Dubai's own resources for the development of local industry. DUGAS' commitment to training also includes sending Nationals abroad for further training.

Dubai Cable Company (Private) Limited (DUCAB)

Annual Report 1995

1995 - A YEAR OF RECORDS, AWARDS & ACHIEVEMENTS

1995 saw Ducab setting ever higher sales and production records and winning further accolades from local and international organisations. Sales reached a magnificent Dirhams 275 million which was an increase of 29% over 1994, in itself was a record year and over 15000 tonnes of metal was processed.

Ducab is a joint venture between the Government of Dubai and the BICC Group, the world's leading cable engineering company. Both partners were proud to see Ducab experience its twelfth consecutive year of growth.

In 1995, Ducab won three major awards:

Firstly, in April, Ducab was presented with the Dubai Quality Award in its first year of inception. Ducab was named Local Industrial Company of the Year, to mark Ducab's high standards of quality of products & service that the company consistently delivers to its customers.

Secondly, Ducab won the Gulf Business Award for the second time. The award was established in 1989 and Ducab was the first winner of this regional award in that year. To mark the continued strides that Ducab has made towards

even greater customer satisfaction, Ducab was again a proud winner in 1995.

Finally, after five consecutive years of winning a Gold Award for safety from the Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents of the UK, Ducab was presented with the Society's Gold Medal. This award recognises Ducab's safety record which makes the factory such a safe environment in which to work. Safety and care of employees is a natural part of a quality manufacturer in any field.

Ducab's outstanding safety performance was recognised even within the safety conscious BICC Cables organisation with the award to Ducab of the BICC Cables Chairman's Shield for Safety.

In 1995, Ducab became the first cable manufacturer in the region to upgrade its quality system from ISO 9002 to the more onerous ISO 9001:1994 - the latest version of the standard. In 1993, Ducab became the first manufacturing company in the region to achieve ISO 9002, and so this latest achievement continues Ducab's position of leadership in the cable industry.

Neil Chesworth, Ducab's General Manager - Sales and Marketing said: "1995 was an outstanding year for Ducab in all aspects with a

record financial performance being accompanied by major recognition from outside the company. All of these factors give each of our employees the confidence and enthusiasm to target even higher achievements in 1996".

BAHRAIN JOINT VENTURE

Continuing Ducab's successful strategy of Joint Venture distributors, Ducab set up a new joint venture distribution company in Bahrain, BICC - Middle East Traders in 1995. Middle East Traders has been a long standing customer of both Ducab's and BICC's products so the joint venture is a logical move to take the company into its next phase of growth and to secure Ducab's market position in Bahrain.

EGYPT JOINT VENTURE

At the end of 1995, Ducab finalised the arrangements and signed the agreement to set up a joint venture factory in Cairo, Egypt. The company, called BICC Egypt, will be modelled on the successful formula that has made Ducab one of the leading companies in the region and will open up the Egyptian market and provide a source of quality power cables.

Charles Hooper from BICC Cables will be BICC Egypt's General Manager reporting to Walter Bailey, Ducab's Managing Director. Walter Bailey said: "This is part of the strategy to make Ducab the hub of BICC Cables manufacturing in the Middle East and will make Ducab an even more powerful force in the region".

The Emirates Telecommunications Corporation Limited (Etisalat) Annual Report 1995

Introduction

Etisalat's performance in 1995 is a continuing record of success in business growth, improved customer services and enhanced technological excellence. Our strategy centered on providing services which rank among the best in the world at competitive prices, offering optimal solutions to customers and strengthening our network infrastructure to build a solid base for future growth.

Customers

With the satisfaction of customers being a focal point, the Corporation has reengineered its critical business activities to reduce the cycle time, to cut down costs, and to improve customer responsiveness in order to achieve high levels of efficiency. Teams of Accounts Managers initiated last year have reinforced their activities to establish individualised relationship with our corporate customers while realignment of activities and resources has further helped Etisalat to provide services along the principle of "one stop shopping".

By these strategic moves, the Corporation responded to the increasingly diverse customer requirements through price competitiveness providing innovative and sophisticated services with most modern products adaptable to market needs and quality service.

The introduction of Internet, store and forward fax service, international frame relay and digital terminal equipment with ISDN compatibility have all been geared to satisfy our customers who rely upon these high-tech services to support business strategies, improve competitiveness, increase productivity and

enhance the quality of life.

Services

Through advanced network infrastructure, Etisalat has continued to maintain its high standards, has introduced a range of products and services to improve the life style of its customers and made it easier for them to be in touch in this increasingly mobile world.

Telephone

Telephone continued to be the core business activity of the Corporation. The number of subscriber lines rose by 57,206 reaching a total of 672,330 lines by the end of 1995 corresponding to a 9% increase over the preceding year. In consequence, the Corporation has maintained its penetration rate of 29 lines per 100 inhabitants, reflecting the highest telephone density in the region.

The Corporation registered a strong growth in public payphones making accessibility to telephone services much easier in high density areas, along the highways and rural areas. Etisalat also embarked on a massive exercise to replace the old with modern smart card operated payphones having high voice quality and enhanced features which are not only convenient to customers but are fraud resistant. Due to extensive utilisation of this service, the installation of public payphones assumed high priority and by the end of 1995 the number of public payphones reached 12,078 from 7,493 representing a phenomenal increase of 61% over 1994.

The positive growth of traffic volume reflects the economic buoyancy, vigorous business environment and unique positioning that the

UAE enjoys, as a telecommunication hub of the region. Domestic traffic increased by 217 million minutes from 1,779 million minutes in 1994 corresponding to a growth of 12% while the traffic volume from international calls registered a phenomenal growth of 73 million minutes from 428 million minutes recorded in the previous year. With such volume of international traffic, Etisalat ranks 28 among major administrations of the world and second in the Gulf region.

In fulfilling customers requirements for wider access to international connections, the Corporation expanded its IDD facilities to make it possible for subscribers to direct call 238 destinations around the world.

Mobile Telephone

The mobile telephone services has remained the fastest growing business activity of the Corporation. This growth has been prompted primarily by cost-efficiency, introduction of hand-held sets at affordable prices, increased network capacity and ability to meet the needs of customers on the move.

The vast number of subscribers for this service have mostly been attracted by the GSM which attained a record growth of 204% over the preceding year, enabling our GSM subscribers to use their mobile telephones in several countries of Europe, Africa, Asia and Australia. At the close of the year, the mobile telephone subscriber base reached 128,495 reflecting an increase of 41% over 91,243 subscribers in 1994. This increase has placed the UAE in the forefront of mobile services with a penetration of 6 mobile telephone subscribers per 100 inhabitants.

Facsimile

Encouraged by the needs and expectations of our customers we have introduced technological innovations in the form of "Fax Plus" to the basic facsimile service. This simple and user friendly service with a wide range of features is

designed to provide cost-effective communication to customers. The Fax Plus service stores and forwards messages and has the ability to send messages to pre-assigned addresses; to notify delivery and non-delivery and to re-transmit messages to the same or other destinations.

Paging

Paging network has been expanded to pave the way for growth and introduction of advanced services, and therefore pagers have become even more popular. By the end of 1995 there were 216,107 pagers in use, an increase of 34,133 over the previous year. The UAE is among the top providers of this service in the Gulf.

ISDN

By making ISDN service more appealing in terms of being customised and price-attractive, the Corporation realised a major breakthrough in the market. At the end of the year, ISDN service had 616 customers corresponding to an increase of 68% over 1994.

ISDN services also registered a substantial increase in international links to provide wide video conferencing coverage for multinational corporate business. This phenomenon reflects the maxim that ISDN is the future-proof network.

Telex

There was a further decline in the use of the telex service though at a lower pace than previously. The decline was due to continued customer preference for the use of faster and more reliable communications services than telex. In 1995 the number of telex customers dropped to 3,544 from 3,898 in 1994 representing a decline in the traffic volume of 14% from 5.8 million minutes registered in 1994.

Data Communications

Data communications are the key services to Corporate customers who operate on national and global basis. In this fast moving business environment, corporate customers are always searching for better, more efficient and cost effective data communication services. To meet the growing demand to access worldwide information resources, Etisalat has continued to provide a wide range of national and international data communication services and information resources.

- (i) **Internet** – The introduction of Emirates Internet has brought desktop connectivity to more than 70,000 networks, 3.5 million computers and approximately 30 million users worldwide and this is expected to expand further by the turn of the century to around 100 million users. This service has opened vast information resources of the world to the customers in UAE. Since its introduction in August 1995, our subscriber base has grown to 2,469 customers and is expected to increase sharply in the coming year.
- (ii) **Frame Relay** – This service which uses packetised data transmission technique through a single access line for integration of high speed LAN and low speed packetised data application, is in the process of establishing itself.
- (iii) **EMDAN** – The market of EMDAN continued to expand as an increasing number of customers make use of this service for data transmission. During 1995, 318 million outgoing segments and 123 million incoming segments were recorded.
- (iv) **EMNET** – The change of marketing strategy and restructuring of tariffs for this service in the latter part of 1994 has enabled this service to maintain a steady growth during the year bringing the subscriber base to 657 by end 1995.

Support Services

1. Computer

1995 is a major milestone year for the IT services within Etisalat. All the application systems associated with business and customer services have been migrated from proprietary environment (HP3000 and IMAGE Database) to open systems environment using UNIX and INGRES Relational Database systems. This migration facilitated low turn-around time for systems development (for new services) and ease of maintenance and support of the software for future years. The new systems enhanced the facilities and information retrieval to provide prompt and reliable services.

2. C.S. ETISALAT

This is the first year since the establishment of submarine cable maintenance facilities that Etisalat experienced a trouble-free year in the operation of its submarine cable systems. The Corporation focused on preventive maintenance of submarine cable system, which in due course further enriched the crews' experience and kept them always in readiness for any eventualities.

INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT

Pursuant with its mission to provide world class network, the Corporation continued to develop, enhance, install and modernise its national and international infrastructure to ensure capacity, reliability and efficiency in telecommunication services.

A total of 49,356 exchange lines were added during the year bringing to a total exchange capacity of 775,454 lines. This represents 7% capacity increase over 1994. With such enhancement, customer service quality was markedly improved, as is evident by very low

network congestion and systems downtime.

The international telephone network was expanded to a total of 7,983 international circuits corresponding to an increase of 27% over 1994. On the digital cellular system (GSM) a total of 61 base stations were installed during the year, enhancing the coverage of GSM system by 25%. Due to the surge in use of GSM system, the exchange capacity was increased by 130,000 lines in 1995 from 30,000 lines in 1994. The capacity for paging system was also enhanced by 137,000 lines in order to serve more efficiently this fast growing service.

Expansion of fibre network took highest priority in the Corporation's programme to develop backbone fibre network diversity. At the year end, a total of 5,043 seath Km., of fibre equivalent to 59,299 fibre Km. has been laid. Plans to provide fibre based local access continued at accelerated pace in order to lay complete foundation for the forthcoming information superhighway.

CUSTOMER EQUIPMENT

Since the liberalisation of customer terminal equipment two years ago, the Corporation has been operating in an increasingly competitive environment. New entrants in the market are exerting pressure on prices with resultant loss in the Corporation's market share. However, this has not deterred the Corporation's commitment to market and maintain customer premises equipment. Until recently, the maintenance commitment ranged from basic telephone set for the houses to sophisticated and intelligent systems for offices. As maintaining basic telephone set is less cost-effective, it is now considered as a disposable item.

In the year under review, Etisalat introduced a number of new telephones in its equipment range to provide wider choice to users. The Key Systems, designed for small to medium sized offices and business customers, have been enhanced by adding new digital models capable of offering tailor-made solutions to the

customer's requirements with analog as well as the latest state of the art ISDN compatible digital system. To cater for major and corporate customers, new PABXs with wide-ranging applications in commerce, industry and public sector have been introduced into the market. These new PABX's are so advanced technologically that they have become an intelligent electronic superhighway, a system that receives, organises, tracks and transmits a huge volume of information. On the mobile front, two new models - ASRAD and SAFSOUF along with new generation of Hud Hud - have been added to Etisalat's range of equipment. These mobiles are each enhanced by additional features including alarm clock, call barring, call forwarding, call line identification, etc.

FINANCIAL STATUS

Results for the year

The financial results for the year 1995 have placed Etisalat in a much stronger and sound position, capable of maintaining the level of investment needed to ensure growth and expansion of the telecommunication infrastructure and services.

The Corporation realised a profit of Dh 1,446 million over the turnover of Dh 3,213 million. This was due largely to increased economic activity and the Corporation's thrust to expand the total telecommunication market which in turn stimulated demand for services. The total turnover for 1995 increased by Dh 319 million (11%) over 1994. While increased utilisation of other services has played a significant role in revenue growth, the major contributor has still been international telephone services. The increase in productivity is reflected in the improvement of staff/line ratio from 7 staff/1000 lines to 6 staff/1000 lines and the profit earned represents a return of 32% on capital employed.

Capital Expenditure

Sound financial performance enabled the Corporation to continue to finance new

technologies involving expansion, enhancement and modernisation of its switching and transmission network. During the year under review, a total of Dh 593 million capital expenditure has been spent on the Corporation's fixed assets.

Investment

Significant initiative was taken up by the Corporation in 1995 to improve its abilities to capitalise upon emerging investment opportunities. In this connection, the Corporation has acquired a 4.7% shareholding in I-CO Global Communications (Holdings) Limited (ICO), a newly formed organisation initiated by International Mobile Satellite Organisation (Inmarsat), which will provide world-wide mobile telecommunication. This is a sound international investment and is expected to give attractive returns when operative.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENT

Great changes in technology and a dynamic market are shaping the future in an unprecedented way. Accordingly, the network of the future will be tailored to satisfy the market with focus on demand, quality and reliability.

The Corporation has developed a clear strategy which will bolster its ability to compete by launching new services; and more importantly to lead the UAE to a new information age.

The Corporation plans a capital expenditure programme of over Dh 3.9 billion phase over a three year period. A major portion of this expenditure is focused on the enhancement and expansion of the network infrastructure which includes switching; GSM system; paging system; optical network system to provide cable T.V. and other services; installation of centralised monitoring and control earth station management system for all UAE earth stations and provision of SDH technology with digital cross connect at traffic nodes.

Installation of submarine cable between Abu Dhabi and Dubai cities is planned to enhance

national network reliability and diversity; while optical fibre submarine cable system (FOG) will connect UAE and Kuwait with branching sections to Bahrain and Qatar; optical fibre submarine cable system between UAE and Pakistan, FLAG and SE-ME-WE3 will provide international network expansion to cater to increased traffic and quality services. IN order to establish itself as a major maintenance facility in the region, the Corporation is in the advanced stage of planning to acquire a new cable ship and to up-grade the existing one.

The Corporation is also planning, in association with other interested administrations, to launch a GEO regional mobile satellite system (MSS) with a capacity of approximately 12,500 channels. This is in addition to a Fixed Satellite System.

The construction of modern and hi-tech offices is progressing at high speed to offer good facilities for servicing customers and serve as prominent landmarks in each Emirate.

TRAINING

Staff remain our greatest asset and the Corporation is fully aware of the value of a motivated, knowledgeable and skilled work force in managing technological advancement and in promoting excellence in service. Accordingly the Corporation has prepared, in addition to academic courses, several training schemes to upgrade staff skills in diverse areas covering installation, maintenance, customer services and managerial skills.

As the growth of training requirements increased, the Corporation established a dedicated Career Development Section within the training department. This section is entrusted with designing a comprehensive career development programme leading to the build up of a solid skilled manpower reservoir of UAE nationals who will assume more and more responsibilities in the operations and management of the Corporation.

By the end of Dec. 1995, Dubai Ports Authority crossed the 2 million TEU container mark. In order to maintain its high service standards the Authority will install two additional gantry cranes, bringing the total number of cranes at its two terminals to twenty five. The two new cranes will be installed at Dubai Ports Authority's Jebel Ali Port, bringing the total number at the terminal to fourteen.

CONTAINERS

Dubai Ports Authority has reported an increase of 10% in container cargo handled during 1995, making a record of 2,073,081 TEU's as against 1.88 million TEU's during 1994.

General Cargo handled by Dubai Ports Authority during 1995 also increased by 12% to make a record of 28,336,622 metric tonnes and there were increases mainly in containers, asphalt, bulk grain, timber, oil products, gases and frozen foodstuff.

Jebel Ali Free Zone Authority Additional facilities offered by the Authority

1. Control of the Free Zone

The responsibilities of Jebel Ali Free Zone Authority include issuing licenses to companies wishing to operate within the zone and to assist those companies with everything from the provision of power supplies to staff recruitment or helping to arrange for their immigration, accommodation, medical facilities and assisting with insurance enquiries.

2. Facilities Available

Companies may lease land on which to erect their own facilities. Subject to availability, the Free Zone Authority can provide warehouses, pre-built factory units, or offices for rent by companies. All infrastructure services are available in the Free Zone area.

3. New Appointment

Companies wishing to operate in the Free Zone must submit proposals to the Free Zone Authority which will issue either a GENERAL or a SPECIAL or a National Industrial or a Free Zone Establishment (FZE) licence to accepted companies.

4. Special Licences

Special Licences are issued to companies incorporated, or otherwise legally established, outside the UAE. In such cases a licence issued by the Dubai Economic Department is not required and ownership of the company may be 100% foreign if desired.

The licence is issued for any activity permitted by the Jebel Ali Free Zone Authority including manufacturing. A company with a Special Licence can only operate in Jebel Ali Free Zone or outside the United Arab Emirates. However, business can be undertaken and sales made in

the UAE through agents or distributors. A company with a Special Licence can purchase goods or services from within the UAE.

5. General Licences

General Licences are issued to companies already holding a valid licence from the Dubai Economic Department (formerly a Municipality Licence), or equivalent permission allowing them to operate within the UAE. Activities similar in nature to those allowed by the company's existing licence will be permitted under their JAFZA General Licence.

Although operating inside the free zone, holders of a General Licence must still comply with federal and municipal requirements relating to their operations in the rest of the UAE.

6. National Industrial Licences

A National Industrial licence is for manufacturing companies which are registered either within or outside the UAE. The ownership or shareholding must be at least 51% AGCC (Arabian Gulf Cooperation Council - Bahrain, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, United Arab Emirates) and the value added to the produce in the Free Zone must amount to a minimum of 40%. This licence provides its holder the same status as local or AGCC companies inside the UAE.

Companies holding a National Industrial Licence qualify for customs duties exemption on their products imported into the AGCC states.

The Jebel Ali Free Zone Authority undertakes the administrative negotiations needed to obtain industrial registrations with the Ministry of Finance & Industry on behalf of the company. Procedures are as follows:

Jebel Ali Free Zone Authority

- a) The company submits an application and project proposal to JAFZA.
- b) JAFZA presents the proposal to the Ministry of Finance & Industry and progresses it on behalf of the company. The Authority provides the link between the applicant and the Ministry of Finance & Industry to resolve any queries.
- c) If the project is accepted in principle, the Ministry of Finance & Industry gives provisional approval and JAFZA issues the National Industrial Licence to the company so that implementation of the project can start.
- d) When the company is ready for production, JAFZA arranges inspection of the factory by the Ministry of Finance & Industry which will issue a certificate (which includes the "industrial registration number") and will notify the Ministry of Economy & Commerce that the company is registered.
- e) The Ministry of Economy & Commerce will notify the AGCC Secretariat, who in turn will notify the AGCC states' customs authorities.
- f) After registration, the Ministry of Economy & Commerce will issue certificates of origin upon the request of the company.

7. Free Zone Establishment (FZE)

The newest of the four different licensing systems under which investing companies can operate, FZE's are single shareholder establishments set up within the zone. They are permitted under Law 9, introduced in 1992 by the Dubai Government, allowing companies of international repute to establish themselves in Dubai through registration in Jebel Ali.

8. Provision of Labour

Staff and labour required by a special or FZE licensee for their operations within the free zone will be provided through the Free Zone Authority under a special hiring agreement by which the licensee retains practical control of recruitment and employment conditions, but the

Free Zone Authority acts as sponsor and will issue the necessary work permits. Upon request the Free Zone Authority will sponsor labour and staff for a General Licensee and National Industrial Licensee under the same conditions as for above mentioned Licensees. Employees sponsored by the Free Zone Authority may not work outside the Free Zone in the United Arab Emirates.

9. Taxes and Charges

Neither class of licensee will be liable to any corporate taxes for 15 years, renewable for an additional 15 years or any personal income taxes, but will pay normal rates of charges for any outside services utilised. Dubai Ports Authority and Free Zone Authority charges and dues will be negotiated by separate agreement.

10. Repatriation of Capital and Profits

All imported capital and profits arising from Free Zone business will be freely transferable abroad.

11. General Conditions

- a) Existing Free Zone Customs regulations will remain unchanged. e.g. there will be no duty on free zone goods unless imported into the United Arab Emirates. The Commercial Agencies law and Municipality restrictions will not apply to goods in transit through the free zone.
- b) Dealings will be prohibited in the following goods:

Raw and prepared opium; cocoa leaves, cannabis resin and preparations whose basis is a resin of cannabis and cocaine; fake counterfeit money; ivory and rhinoceros horn whether raw or worked.

Dealings in arms, ammunition and explosives will be restricted in accordance with existing regulations.

Jebel Ali Free Zone Authority Achievements during 1995

By the end of Dec. 1995, the number of companies in the Free Zone representing 72 countries in the world, grew from 725 to 900, an average of 14.6 per month as opposed to 13.33 companies per month in 1994. Of the companies in the Jebel Ali Free Zone, 40% are from the leading industrial countries. Fifty three percent of the company's capital is invested in manufacturing or assembly; forty four percent is in trading; wholesaling and distribution; the remaining three percent in the service activities.

Records continued to be broken at Dubai International Airport in 1995 with more international carriers and yet another significant growth in both passenger and cargo traffic.

Now work is underway on a huge expansion programme designed to meet expected demand up to the year 2020. Forecasts are that present traffic will more than double within six years.

The airport handled a total of 7.1 million passengers in 1995 compared to 6.3 million in 1994, an increase of 12.76%. Cargo traffic rose to 315,810 tonnes compared to 249,257 tonnes in 1994, an increase of 26.7%.

Dubai International Airport also recorded impressive performances in aircraft movements and duty free sales, underlying its role as a traditional and increasingly popular stopover on the east-west and north-south air routes.

It handled a daily average of 306 movements, totalling 111,693 for the year of which nearly 75,000 were scheduled flights.

Undoubtedly one of the highlights of the year was the Dubai 95 international airshow which attracted 500 exhibitors from 34 nations. A record 104 aircraft were on display with 25

taking part in a spectacular daily airshow. Dubai 95, now firmly established as the third international airshow behind Paris and Farnborough, was attended by more than 350 journalists and received worldwide coverage.

Global destinations

Dubai international, already serving 75 airlines operating scheduled services to 108 destinations worldwide, continued to attract new services and carriers in 1995. A number of airlines boosted frequencies or added Dubai as a new stopover on their international routes.

New carriers which launched services include Transero Airlines, Royal Air Maroc, Caspian Airlines, Sochi Airlines, Korean Airlines, Shaheen Air International, Armenian Airlines and Redsea Airways.

Passenger handling

Ranked as one of the top ten airports in the world, Dubai International can handle all types of aircraft from the massive Russian Antonov 124 transporter, to the Supersonic Concorde and the largest of wide-bodied commercial jets.

Passenger clearance time through the airport is one of the fastest in the world - on average 12

minutes to clear immigration, baggage claim and customs.

Dubai Airport's high-tech Cargo Village handled an average of 865,216 kilos per day, nearly 30% over the 1994 throughput. Sea-air cargo accounted for a sizeable share of total volume at the village, where super-efficiency ensures that locally-destined cargo is cleared in just 30 minutes and perishable goods in a world-breaking 20 minutes from the time a consignee arrives at the terminal.

The much-lauded Dubai Duty Free continues to distinguish itself as one of the world's leading airport shopping facilities. Sales reached a record high of US\$172 million, a 19.28% increase over the previous year.

The Duty Free Finest Surprise - one of the longest running promotions in the world - produced 134 luxury car winners during the year - an average of two cars being given away every five or six days. More than 500 cars have now been presented since this promotion began in 1989.

Dubai Aviation College - a unique institution in the Gulf - also enhanced its reputation in 1995, expanding its number of short courses and seminars to meet an ever-increasing demand for quality training from industry and commerce in general to the aviation industry itself.

Into the future

Dubai International Airport is poised for a period of massive expansion which is designed to double its capacity and ensure that it continues to be the busiest commercial aviation hub in the Middle East and one of the most advanced airports in the world.

The expansion project will cost US\$500 million and is scheduled for completion by the summer of 1999.

A new concourse with 28 aircraft positions will be the centrepiece of the development. The building will be 800 metres long and 80 metres wide, making it about the same size as Terminal 4 at London Heathrow.

The new terminal will have an elegant, smooth, aerodynamic profile that is in keeping with the look and feel of the high speed aircraft which will use the facility. The building is curved both longitudinally and axially. The exterior will be a steel structure with glazed glass panels in a blue-green tinting, giving the concourse a cool shimmering look, suggestive of sky colours.

It will be architecturally unique, and a tourist attraction in itself with facilities second to none.

At the centre of the concourse, will be five levels. On the upper two levels will be a 100 room hotel which will provide an excellent quality of comfortable accommodation for transit passengers with long lay-overs. It will also contain a 500 seat food court and an a-la-carte restaurant and bar, private dining rooms, health spa, swimming pool, beauty salon and a full service business and conference centre to cater to today's extensive business travel needs.

Below this will be the boarding level with spacious holding lounges for each of the 28 aircraft gates. Within the holding lounges there will be a small kiosk selling books, drinks and snacks etc.

On the apron level will be the airport's duty free shopping area, nearly four times the size of the current Duty Free.

At the lowest level will be a passenger tunnel equipped with moving walk-ways to ensure an easy and speedy arrival to the destination required.

The expansion is being undertaken on the basis of a master plan which was drawn up by International Bechtel Inc. the American construction and engineering company, which forecast continued dramatic growth for Dubai International, well into the next century.

The expansion is designed for both short term and long term needs. One of the first facilities to come into operation will be a new Charter Terminal which is due to be completed in mid - 1997. It will cater to Haj flights, charter flights, and executive flights.

The Duty Free in this terminal will be geared towards 'bulk buying' especially catering to visitors from CIS countries, many of whom arrive on charter flights for shopping expeditions.

Airport Free Zone

Dubai International Airport's planned Free Zone is intended to provide an international class development that offers a supporting environment to high quality companies in a wide variety of technology-driven industries.

A total land area of 2.2 million square metres including apron space of 473,000 square metres has allocated on the north side of the airport. Phase 1 of the Free Zone will consist of 1 million square metres of development with ten parking bays capable of handling up to 10 B-747's simultaneously.

The Free Trade Zone will provide an unequalled level of quality service, developing a one-stop service centre for its tenant

companies. It will assist with application paperwork, visa applications, executive site visits, marketing, relocation requirements, staffing and employment requirements, and act as an interface with various Municipality and Government offices.

The target technology companies will be clean, environmentally appropriate, and compatible with both the adjacent office and airport activities. Since manufacturing in high technology industries is dependent largely upon a trained labour pool available at reasonable cost, and because Dubai will be competing against other highly competitive countries, the offering will be paired with an employee training and incentive programme aimed at meeting the needs of companies. The Free Zone in time, plans to develop state of the art teaching centres for the various technical requirements within the Free Zone.

A significant advantage of the Park's airport location will be the extensive airline connectivity it provides to travelling businessmen.

The Airport is already clearly valued as a distribution and logistics entrepot as evidenced by rapid cargo growth and its recent selection by DHL and FedEx for courier facilities. Similarly, aircraft maintenance and repair activities will find the Airport an attraction location for their needs. The intent is to build on this strength and to expand into other technology areas over time.

The light industrial facilities at the Park are intended to support the distribution, assembly and manufacturing activities of tenant companies. A wide variety of parcel sizes will be made available to accommodate large and small companies, thereby achieving flexibility.

Safety and Security

Dubai International Airport continued to build on its excellent safety and security record during 1995 with the management ensuring that it continues to be one of the best equipped airports in the world.

Priority continued to be given to air traffic control, airfield safety and security, radio navigational aids, communications, meteorology, and the emergency services.

The airport's sophisticated Air Traffic Control Centre is equipped with an advanced triple radar system, giving controllers the ability to monitor aircraft and vehicle movement over long distances in all weather conditions.

The Plessey Watchman Primary Radar provides visual indication of an approaching aircraft up to 80 nautical miles away, enabling controllers to direct an aircraft's final approach to the runway.

A secondary radar, the Cossor Monopulse SSR, automatically requests each approaching aircraft to identify itself and provide other vital data. This is immediately relayed to the control tower where the data is displayed on the air traffic controller's screen.

Supplementing these radars is a Ground Movement Radar which monitors aircraft and vehicle operations on the runway, taxiways and aprons. In addition, the airport has four instrument landing systems and advanced airfield lighting, communications and meteorological forecasting systems.

All of this state-of-the-art equipment has earned Dubai International Airport a Category II classification by the International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO). It ensures that an aircraft

can be brought to land safely even if the cloud base is as low as 30 metres and visibility only 200 metres.

Fire fighting

The airport's Fire Department has four strategically located stations ensuring less than two minutes response to an emergency wherever it may occur on the airfield.

Equipment includes two Jumbo Cheetah rapid intervention vehicles and six fire engines including a Simbah with a capacity of 17,500 litres of foam and water.

All 135 fire service personnel are highly trained professionals. Their advanced fire-fighting equipment has a combined discharge capacity of more than 33,000 litres of water, exceeding the 24,300 litre capacity stipulated under ICAO Category IX - the highest standard attainable.

As part of its safety programme, the Fire Department conducts rigorous emergency drills every month and maintains a fully-equipped medical centre with wheelchairs, mobile units and ambulances on 24-hour stand-by.

In compliance with ICAO recommendations, annual disaster exercises are conducted in co-operation with Dubai police, local hospital and the City fire brigade.

Security

Airport security is operated by the Dubai police who provide a passenger friendly, but extremely efficient service. Equipment is provided by the Department of Civil Aviation.

Baggage is run through X-ray machines to check for weapons or explosives before check-in

and hand baggage and body checks are carried out before passengers proceed to the aircraft holding lounge.

Police patrols, video cameras, electronically controlled doors and closed-circuit televisions, both within the terminal and outside the building are all used to ensure that passengers using Dubai International Airport travel in safety.

Safety measures are also being constantly reviewed to ensure that international developments are taken into account.

Dubai Police Air Wing

Operating from its base at Dubai International Airport, Dubai Police Air Wing plays an important role in safety and security throughout the northern Emirates.

With six helicopters, the Air Wing is responsible for patrolling sea, desert, mountain and urban areas, often operating in harsh conditions with high temperatures, high humidity and much of their work involving landings in sandy, dusty, or saline environments.

While its area of responsibility is mainly the emirate of Dubai, the wing has been asked to support other Emirates police and act as the co-ordination centre for search and rescue in the event of an air crash.

The Wing was established in 1978 with four Bell JetRangers and in 1981 added MBB BO105s equipped with police and medevac equipment. It has nine full time operational pilots who operate a service around the clock.

Their duties range from routine patrols, both on land and over the sea, to rescue missions and

quickly transferring accident victims to hospital.

Dubai Cargo Village

1995 was another record year for Dubai Cargo Village with a rise in business of more than 26 per cent, reinforcing Dubai's position as one of the leading air freight centres in the world.

A total of 315,810 tonnes of cargo was uplifted and discharged during the year, compared to 249,257 tonnes in 1994. The highest monthly cargo movement was in November, with 29,022 tonnes, an increase of 28.81% over the same month in 1994.

The Cargo Village, which will complete five years of operation during 1996 added to its list of prestigious international awards when it was presented with The Golden Globe, by Festival Co-operation International Sans Frontiers, Casablanca. It repeated its success of the previous year by again gaining the Best Airport: Middle East at the 9th Asian Freight Industry Awards, hosted by Cargonews Asia.

The Cargo Village is located next to the main airport building and has a handling capacity of 350,000 tonnes per annum (950 tonnes daily), with built-in capacity to increase to 450,000.

The cargo building has ground area of 24,985 sq.m., handling area of 8,300 sq.m., office space of 7,800 sq.m. and storage capacity of 5,000 tonnes. The building gives out to a new apron where cargo aircraft can load and unload up to four B747 freighters, or a combination of two B747s and three narrow-bodied freighters, at any one time.

The warehouse within a bonded area consists of 308 ULDs as well as racks for small, medium and large warehouse pallets. There are

special sections for valuables, explosives, radioactive materials, live animals and human remains and an air-conditioned warehouse, cold storage for perishables and a vault for extremely valuable goods. A semi-automated system is being used for the assigning and locating of cargo. Computers are used to designate storage areas and track freight throughout the system.

Warehouse employees deliver items to and from the racks, using elevating transfer vehicles, transfer vehicles, forklifts and conveyor belts.

Cargo storage racks with facility for storing, include small warehouse pallets with 1,520 positions, regular - 1,116 positions, large - 744 positions and minishipments - 760 (single positions). It also has 18 positions for storing perishables.

The cargo warehouse has 12 truck docks for import cargo, 12 truck docks for export cargo, 11 truck docks for perishable cargo and 7 docks solely for sea/air traffic.

The Cargo Village has a large sea/air cargo volume owing to the proximity of the cargo village to Port Rashid (15 minutes by road) and Jebel Ali (45 minutes) with handling time from ship to plane, less than four hours. Goods arriving from ports in bonded vehicles are offloaded at one of the seven sea/air docks.

The free zone concept, with no red tape, represents an efficient system for fast and unhampered processing.

Within the cargo village, a separate building houses most of the cargo agents and freight forwarders. The ground floor of the agents building consists of different sized warehouses while on the first level there are agents' offices. Cargo agents take delivery of consolidations and

later distribute the cargo to their individual clients. They also have the facility to build the ULDs within their warehouses.

Already established as the distribution hub of the Gulf and Middle East, Dubai's highly developed transport infrastructure, efficient ports, modern international airport and low shipping and storage costs make it a perfect base for serving not only its traditional trading partners in the Arab World, East Africa and the Indian subcontinent, but increasingly new markets farther afield.

Dubai Aviation College

Since its inauguration in 1991, Dubai Aviation College has become a unique centre of excellence in the Middle East, dedicating itself to training ambitious young people who see Aviation as one of the growth industries of the Gulf Region.

Current enrolment embraces some 27 nationalities and the College accepts both individual students and corporately-sponsored groups. Clients of the College include Departments of Civil Aviation, Airlines, Military and Police forces. In addition, training is provided on behalf of customs departments, port authorities, government departments and private industrial and commercial organisations.

Specialist courses

The College offers specialist courses in Air Traffic Control Preparation, ATC Aerodrome and Approach (Procedural) Control, Meteorological Studies, Operations/Flight Dispatch, Search and Rescue and National Diplomas in Aerospace Studies and Electrical and Electronics Engineering.

The College also offers a range of short courses including Aviation Security, Dangerous Goods and First Aid at work. New for 1996 are the US FAA Commercial Pilot Licence and the US FAA Aircraft Dispatcher course. If required, course graduates may apply to university for entrance to a degree programme.

A number of evening courses have been introduced covering areas such as languages and business. For its corporate clients, the college aims to increase the number and scope of training provided in-house to clients in the GCC and as far afield as Africa and Asia.

Training Schemes

The UK Civil Aviation Authority approves the College's National Diploma in Aerospace Studies (aircraft maintenance) as qualifying

towards the CAA Licence Without Type Rating examinations. Students train for two years at the College before completing their training in the UK with Air UK Technical College.

The College has well established links with reputed overseas institutions such as Brighton College in Britain and Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University in the USA. Practical training takes place at both the college and at Dubai International Airport.

Within the teaching block at the College are classrooms for air traffic control, electronics, a workshop for aircraft engineering and avionics, library and language laboratory. The College has a state-of-the-art computer laboratory for teaching basic skills, together with technology, business and finance. The College also has a state-of-the-art air traffic control simulator.

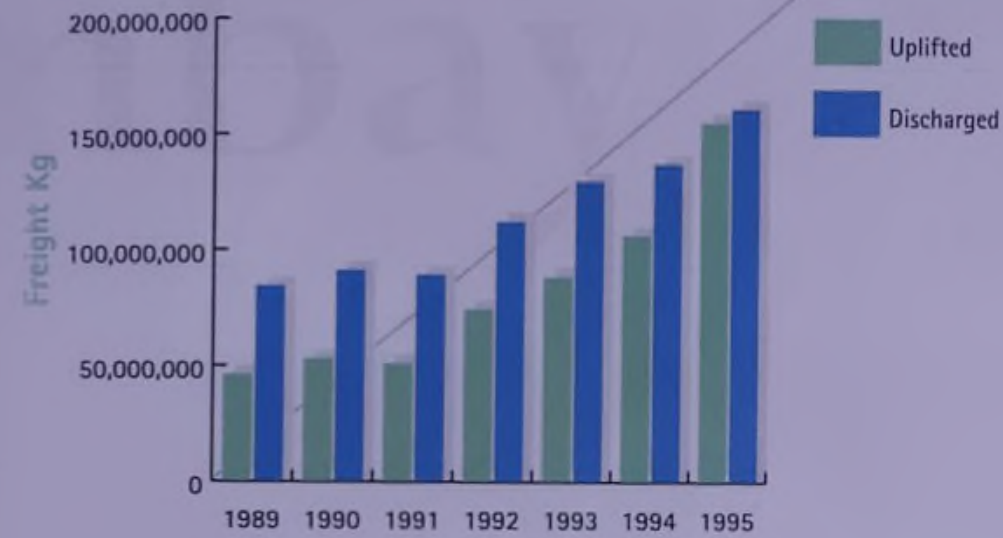

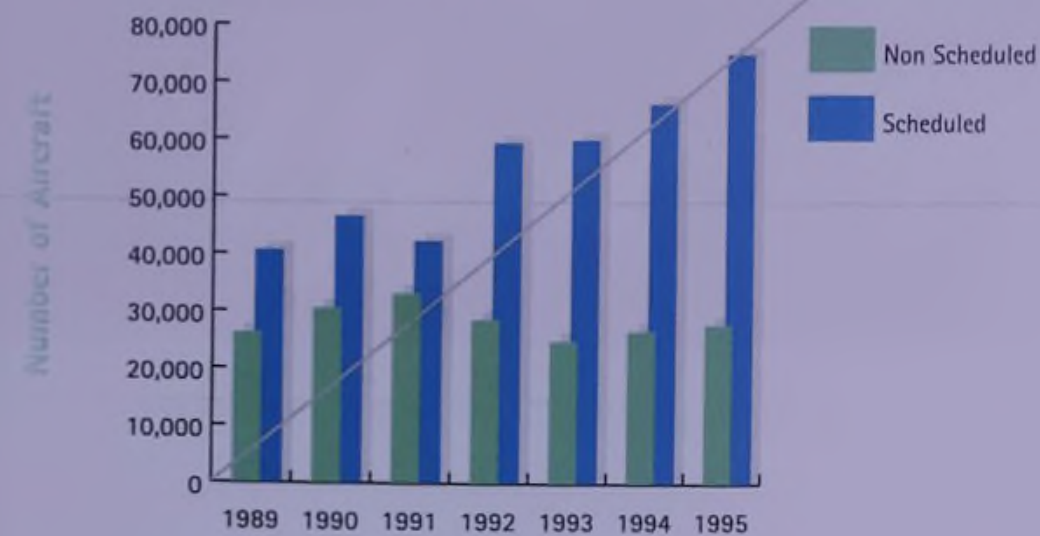

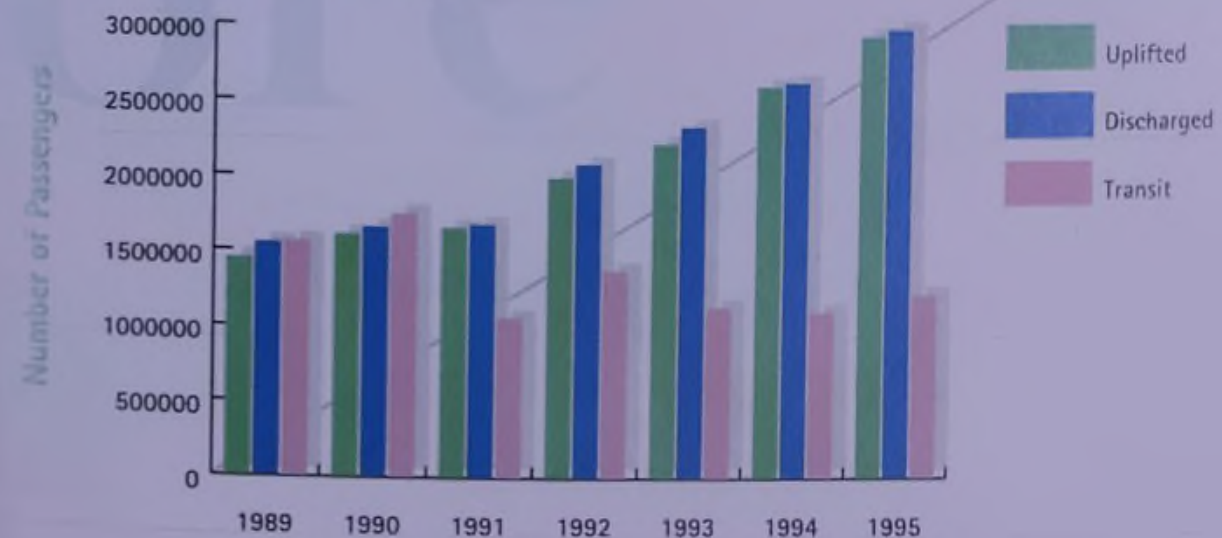
Freight Movement

Annual Review 1995

Emirates began 1995 on a winning streak with seven new awards resulting from the readership poll by UK's Executive Travel Magazine. Emirates was voted Best carrier to the Middle East, Best Long Haul Carrier, Airline with the Best First Class, Airline with the Best Economy Class and Airline with the Best Inflight Entertainment. Emirates also came second place for Best Business Class and Best Inflight Food.

In June 1995, Emirates launched twice weekly services to Johannesburg in South Africa, via the Comoros Islands in the Indian Ocean. Six months later, the airline added a third, non-stop service between Dubai and Johannesburg, in response to demand on the sector.

In October, Emirates added two destinations - Nairobi in Kenya and Ho Chi Minh city in Vietnam - expanding its network to 38 destinations. Both cities received twice weekly services from Dubai.

In December, Emirates confirmed plans to fly to Melbourne, Australia, following the successful conclusion of a Memorandum of understanding with the Australian government in November 1995.

Twice weekly services to Melbourne will commence in June 1996, operated with the brand-new Boeing 777 aircraft. Melbourne becomes Emirates' 39th destination.

The Emirates Group, comprising Emirates and DNATA, ended Financial year 1994/95 with a 23.9 percent increase in profit over the previous Financial Year.

The results were announced in July 1995 by H.H. Sheikh Ahmed bin Saeed Al Maktoum, chairman of the Emirates group.

Sheikh Ahmed said: "Emirates is well placed to continue its progress with one of the youngest aircraft fleets in the world, with an average age per aircraft set to fall to about four years, following the sale of the Boeing 727's. DNATA too, has continued to provide a comprehensive travel service for the Business traveller and in order to expand, in its 36th year, has moved into the international market".

From June 1996, the airline will take delivery of seven of the next generation Boeing 777 aircraft, with options on another seven. The Boeing 777's, to be powered by Rolls Royce RB211 Trent engines, represent the biggest ever aircraft order concluded by Emirates, in a deal worth US\$2 billion.

Mr. Maurice Flanagan, Emirates Group Director, said: "We intend to be well placed to meet the requirements of the future and ensure that Emirates emerges as a good sized airline by the year 2,000"

Leisure activities are another area which Emirates has keenly developed. In 1993, Emirates spearheaded the formation of Dubai's first Destination Management Company, Arabian Adventures, which is instrumental in the promotion of Dubai as a tourist, commercial and incentive destination to international markets. Emirates also established Emirates Holidays, now the largest wholesale tour operator of the

Middle East, which markets leisure products to 37 destinations across the world.

Emirates reputation for innovation is best illustrated by the airline's decision to install personal video systems in every seat in the First, Business and Economy cabins of its wide-bodied fleet. The project, initiated in May 1992 at a cost of US\$1.4 million per aircraft, is another pioneering effort in civil aviation, which set an industrial trend for other airlines to follow.

Emirates' attention to service and quality

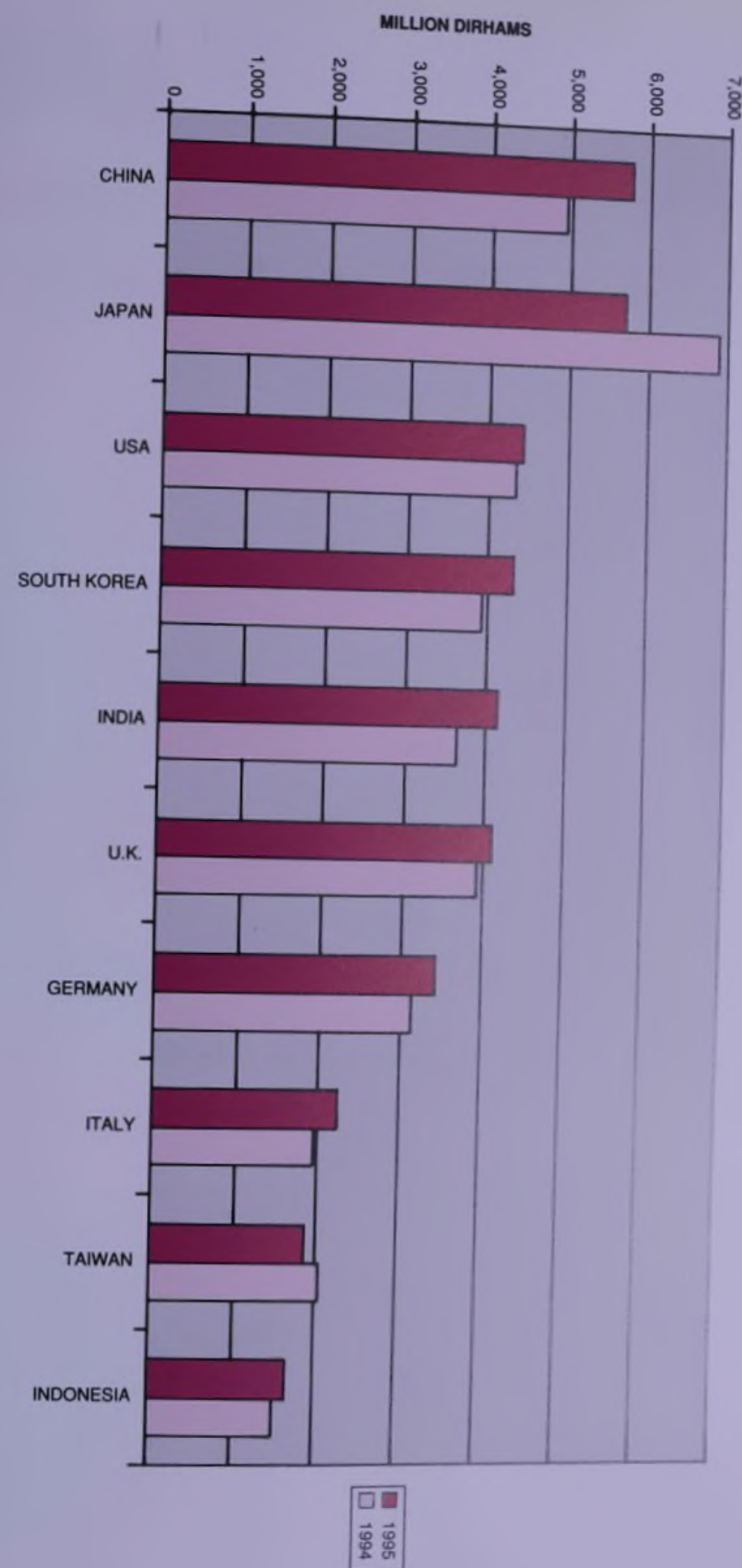

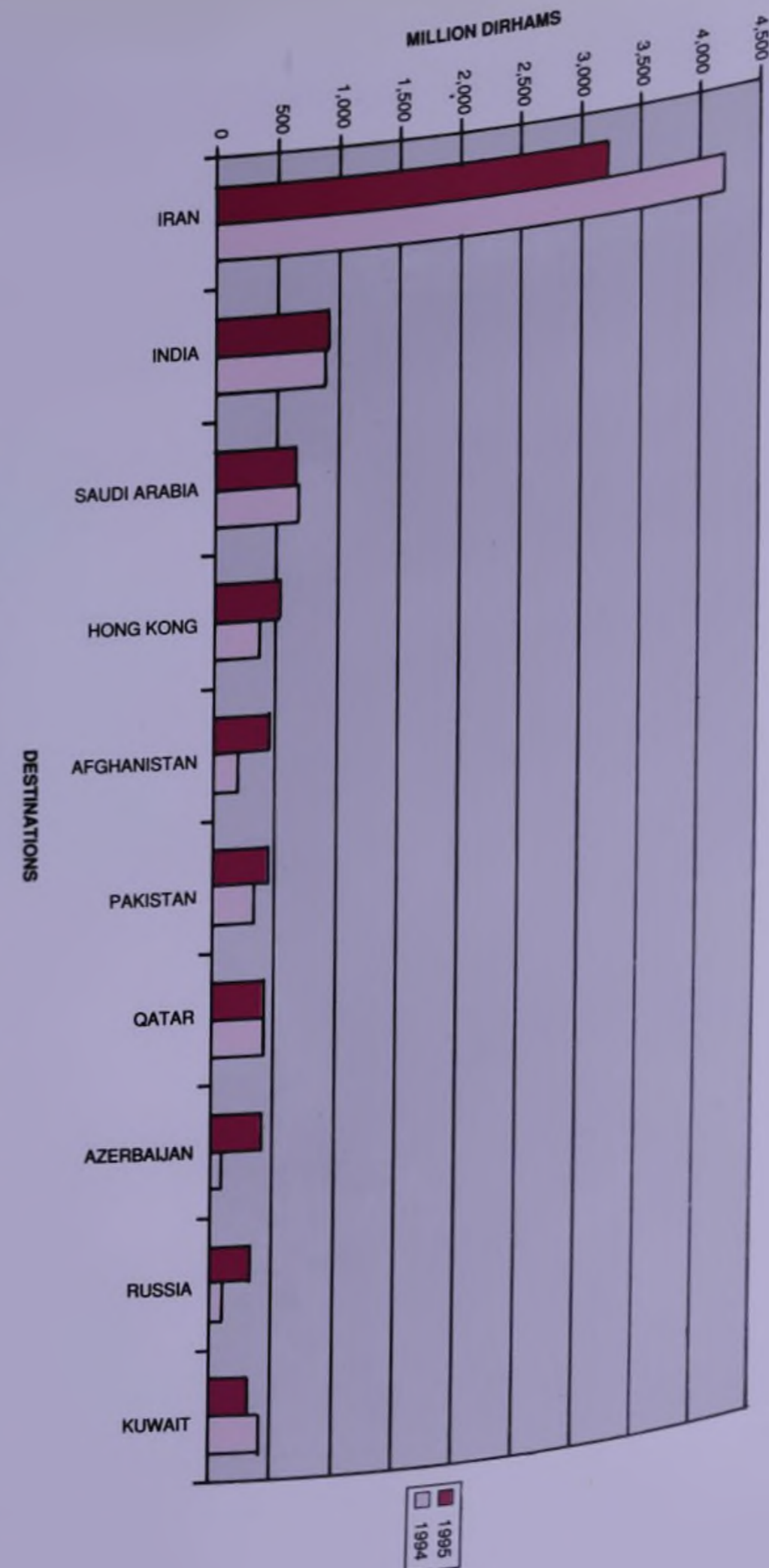

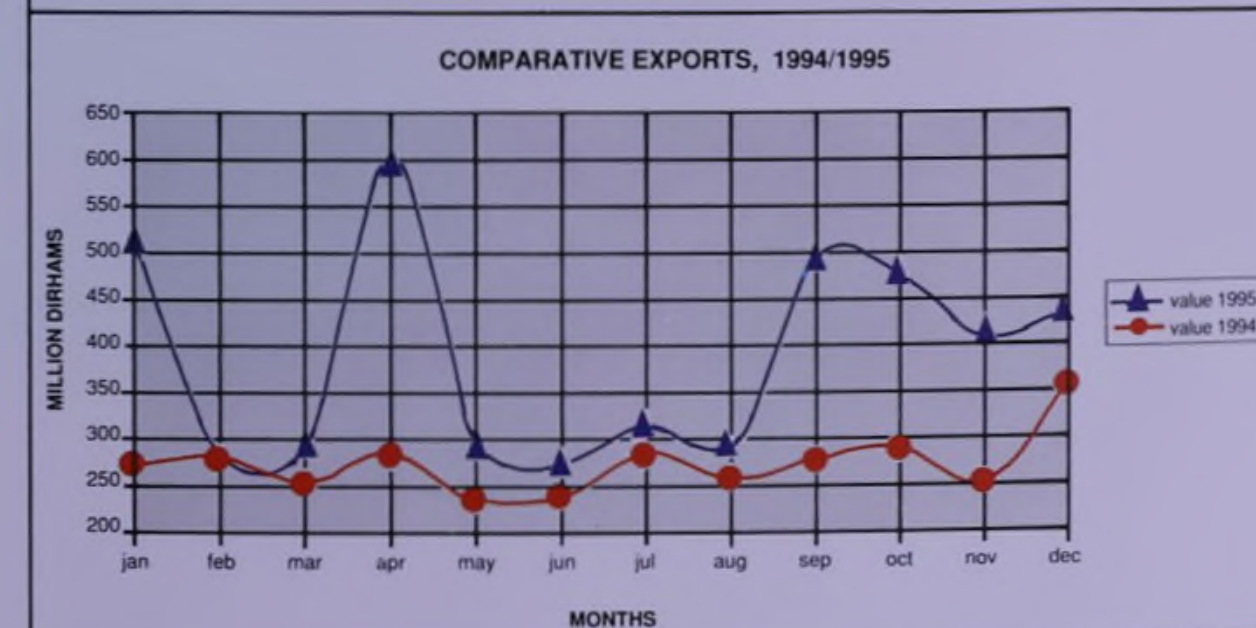
